

# International Student Aid

## Citizen/Eligible Non-citizen Requirements

---

According to the U.S. Department of Education, you must be one of the following in order to receive federal student aid:

- U.S. citizen.
- U.S. national (includes natives of American Samoa or Swain's Island).
- U.S. permanent resident who has an I-151, I-551, or I-551C (Alien Registration Receipt Card).
- If you're not in one of these categories, you must have an Arrival-Departure Record (I-94) from the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) showing one of the following designations in order to be eligible:
  - "Refugee"
  - "Asylum Granted"
  - "Indefinite Parole" and/or "Humanitarian Parole"
  - "Cuban-Haitian Entrant, Status Pending"
  - "Conditional Entrant" (valid only if issued before April 1, 1980)

If you have only a Notice of Approval to Apply for Permanent Residence (I-171 or I-464), you are not eligible for federal student aid.

If you're in the United States on an F1 or F2 student visa, a J1 or J2 exchange visitor visa, or a G series visa (pertaining to international organizations), you are also not eligible for federal student aid.
