



**Dr Anna Alomes** is a philosopher who works for the promotion of compassion and the reduction of violence. She has a particular interest in applied philosophy and transformation at grass roots level in communities.

Born in London and living in Australia, she undertook a mid-career PhD [1996-98] studying under Professor Jay L Garfield [currently Smith College USA]

Anna recently spent 5 years as the Director of the Centre for Applied Philosophy and Ethics at the University of Tasmania receiving the Vice Chancellor's Award for Outstanding Community Engagement. She worked on ethics and harm-minimisation programs for police services, nursing and medical ethics, leadership programs, the Tibetan Exchange program, lectured on the philosophy of nonviolence and supervised postgraduate students.

She now works on selected peace-building and organisational improvement projects from an independent base.
