

Bleeding Tissue Paper Art

Description of Activity

On November 17th, the children were able to participate in a creative art activity using bleeding tissue paper and spray bottles full of water. To create their own unique works of art, the children were asked to place pieces of colored tissue paper on top of watercolor paper. They then sprayed the tissue paper pieces with water from the spray bottles.



Activity Objectives

When planning this activity, there were three objectives that I hoped for the children to meet. They were:

1. The students will reference the instruction cards on the table for guidance as they engage in the activity
2. The students will use the spray bottles correctly to spray the tissue paper on their pictures.
3. The students will describe the colors that are created from the mixing of two other colors.

Why Creative Art?

Creative art allows children an opportunity to express their feelings and thoughts in a non-verbal manner. It also provides children with the opportunity to practice various fine motor skills that will be crucial throughout the rest of their lives. This activity also allowed the children to explore different materials within their environment and how different materials can affect each other. This in turn helps to develop the children's abstract and creative thinking skills.
