

The Anne S. Gabbard-Alley Scholarship for Graduate Studies in Health Communication is a one-time, merit-based scholarship awarded annually to a first-year graduate student pursuing a master's degree in Communication and Advocacy, with concentration in Health Communication. The award amount is \$1000.00.

To be eligible, a student must have met all acceptance requirements for admission as a full-time student in the Masters of Arts in Communication and Advocacy program, demonstrated excellence as an undergraduate student, have two faculty recommendations from their undergraduate program, and demonstrate a desire to pursue scholarship in the Health Communication concentration. Beyond the above criteria, the appointment of the AGA Scholarship will follow the university's guidelines for the awarding of scholarships.

Students awarded the AGA Scholarship will be expected to remain enrolled full-time, remain in good academic standing, and meet criteria for "successful progression" toward the degree, as outlined by The Graduate School of James Madison University. This application must be submitted concurrently with an application for admission to the Master of Arts program in Communication and Advocacy at James Madison University.
