Emeriti Association Legacy Grant

Beginning in 2006, the Emeriti Association has awarded an annual grant to a JMU faculty member. When established, the grant was unanimously supported by the association's members and the grant rotates each year to a different JMU division. The dean of the selected division nominates a full-time tenured faculty member who does not hold an endowed chair or a funded professorship to receive the grant. Recommended uses of the grant are research, creative projects, travel related to professional development, enhancement of teaching, additional education, or other professional expenses. Past recipients have been Professor Newell Wright, Marketing (2006); Professor Raymond "Skip" Hyser, History (2007); Professor Teresa Harris, Early Childhood Education (2008); Professor Ann Myers, Social Work (2009); Professor Hassan Hamdan, Mathematics and Statistics Department (2010); Dr. Don Rierson, Music Department (2011); and Dr. Scott Hammond, Political Science Department (2012).

Association Officers Attend AROHE Conference

Rex Fuller, president, Violet Allain, vice president, and Nancy O'Hare, past president, attended the tenth biennial conference of the international association of retirement organizations in higher education (AROHE), October 21 through 24. Held in Chapel Hill, NC, the conference was hosted by a coalition of three public universities in the Research Triangle Area: North Carolina Central University at Durham, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and North Carolina at Raleigh. Special events for the attendees were held on each campus.

Registered for the conference were 122 members, representing 79 colleges and universities throughout the United States and Canada. Our representatives heard expert presentations and participated in networking in order to improve and strengthen our organization.

Nancy O'Hare served as moderator of a discussion group focusing upon encouraging and retaining members in emeriti organizations, and as a member of the International and Nominating Committees. She is a former member of the AROHE Board of Directors. Rex Fuller has been nominated for a Board position for 2013-15.

AROHE's mission is to enhance, develop, and advance retiree organizations as they continue their valuable contributions to the academic community. It is a resource for best practices and international trends to foster the development of emeriti associations.
