REQUIREMENTS

The cross disciplinary minor in world literature offers students the opportunity to study literary and artistic productions from Africa, Asia, the Caribbean Islands, continental Europe, Latin America, the Middle East and a special interest area (Native America, African America, Asian America, Immigrant Britain). The minor provides students with a bridge to understanding new cultures and languages, and to develop a clear understanding of social context and artistic expression by encouraging them to think outside the local and on a more global level.

The minimum requirement for a minor in world literature is 18 hours. Six credit hours may be double-counted between the minor and the major or general education courses. In addition to the gateway course, **ENG 239**, students can take one 200-level course to count toward the minor. The **Department of English** and the **Foreign Languages, Department of Literatures and Cultures**, offer a range of courses which will fulfill the minor. Courses from disciplines other than English and foreign languages may be considered for credit with the prior approval of the coordinator.
