#### 1. Approval of minutes

## 2. Announcements & Reports

Michael Stoloff shared APR updates.

The on-site external review of the APR will take place April 2<sup>nd</sup>-4<sup>th</sup>. During that time period, a meeting will be held for Graduate Council members to discuss concerns and suggestions with the external review team.

Terry Dean highlighted information about the annual Scholarship Showcase. Both the Graduate Scholarship Showcase and The Graduate School Awards Reception will take place on April 20<sup>th</sup> in Madison Union Ballroom. Calls for proposals and nominations have been posted. Encouragement of participation from graduate faculty would be appreciated.

Jie Chen discussed the Graduate Certificate Task Force. Chris Arndt will serve as the chair of the task force, and other members will be announced soon. The group will meet every other week. Jie thanked everyone for participating in and volunteering to be a part of the task force.

Michael Stoloff has recently been appointed to the Engagement Advisory Group. He has been asked to meet with graduate faculty to discuss how they are acting to further the mission of having an engaged university. Michael will be holding a meeting on February 23, from 1:30-2:30 in Student Success Center to discuss the roles faculty play in engagement. Faculty may also send Michael an email describing their roles.

A survey has been emailed to all faculty regarding the university's brand. All are highly encouraged to complete this survey, as it will be influential in the future of JMU's brand.

Catie Mathers gave the GSA report.

On January 29<sup>th</sup>, the GSA voted to readjust their budget. They will now offer ten \$100 grants for professional development; the application is being released soon.

**Program Changes** 

Kristi Shackelford provided an overview of the program changes that will take effect for the Behavior Specialist M.Ed., EXED 5<sup>th</sup> Year M.A.T. K-12 Concentration, and the Strategic Leadership Studies Ph.D.

#### Honor Code Discussion

Chris Campbell from Career & Academic Planning joined the meeting to discuss honor code policies and procedures. Some graduate faculty believe graduate-level honor code violations are handled too lightly. Others believe the hearings for graduate students may not be accurately judged, as student members of the Honor Council are typically undergraduate students.

The consensus seemed to be that a separate panel should exist in the Honor Council for graduate students, as undergraduate students may not be familiar with theses, dissertations, and comprehensive exams; therefore, they may not be able to accurately judge each situation. Most of the Graduate Council agreed that our graduate students should be held to a higher standard.

#### April Meeting

The idea of reintroducing an April Graduate Council meeting was proposed. Members of the Council came to the consensus that an April meeting will not be held, because faculty are very busy during that time period.
