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Introduction

Background

James Madison University's Institute for Innovation in Health and Human Services (IIHHS) is pleased to present the 2019 Youth Data Survey for Harrisonburg and Rockingham County. The YDS has taken place every two years since 1997 and continues to provide key data about local youth risk behaviors that enables the community to develop priority areas around youth issues. Administered by IIHHS, the Youth Data Survey (YDS) is a collaborative effort involving many community partners, including: United Way of Harrisonburg and Rockingham County, Harrisonburg City and Rockingham County Public Schools, Eastern Mennonite High School, James Madison University, the Healthy Community Council, Sentara RMH Community Health, the Blue Ridge Area Health Education Center, and the Futuro Latino Coalition. Over 50 agency representatives and community volunteers assist with the administration of the survey every two years. The goal of the YDS is to examine the current and longitudinal trends around local youth risk behaviors with an approach that taps into the larger community question of what assets we need in our community to help people successfully navigate from infancy to adulthood. The YDS has the following objectives for the community: produce reliable information on risk behaviors; assess needs; ascertain gaps in service; assist in determining priority areas; allow agencies access to local data in order to write successful state, federal, and foundation grant applications to address the identified needs; and evaluate the impact agency programs have on the local youth over time. The ultimate goal is to improve the quality of life for the children and youth in Harrisonburg and Rockingham County.

Every two years in the fall a locally created survey is administered to approximately half of all 8th, 10th, and 12th graders in Harrisonburg City and Rockingham County. Every 10 years a committee comprised of local agency representatives and interested community members evaluate the survey and make any necessary additions and revisions. JMU students assist IIHHS staff and help secure and train agency representatives and community volunteers to administer the survey. This report would not be possible without the support of our local schools, community organizations and many dedicated volunteers.

The survey was administered during the last three weeks of October 2019 to youth in Harrisonburg City and Rockingham County. Surveys were completed by 1,825 students (approximately 841 females, 925 males, 17 transgender youth, and 29 gender non-conforming youth) between the ages of 13 and 19.



What the numbers and other information told us:


The majority of teens still live with both parents, and the number has increased by 0.3% since 2017.

The majority of youth are not employed (67.2%), a 4.7% decrease from 2017. Additionally, 32.5% of youth are employed (full or part time).




Since 2016, Harrisonburg's dropout rate has remained above 9% and Rockingham County's dropout rate has remained around 4%.


Since 2015 Rockingham County has maintained a fairly consistent number of students enrolled in public schools while Harrisonburg has continued a steady incline in enrollment.

All grades levels showed a slight decrease in the percentage of students who reported making good grades often or a lot.



What the numbers and other information told us:


The number of 8th and 10th grade youth reporting having had sexual intercourse has increased slightly since 2017. However, the percentage of 12th grade students reporting having had sexual intercourse has decreased by 2.5%.


What the numbers and other information told us:

In 2019, 69% of teens report that they are sexually abstinent, which is a decrease of 2.6% from 2017.



What the numbers and other information told us:


There is a steady increase across grades in the amount of youth that talk to their parents about sex, reaching 49.1% by the time they are in 12th grade. Of all youth surveyed, 43.4% report that they talk to their parents about this topic sometimes, often, or a lot. This is a slight decrease from 46.4% in 2017.


What the numbers and other information told us:

The proportion of youth who are sexually active increases steadily as frequency of alcohol use increases. Of youth that do not use alcohol, 15.3% report having had intercourse. Additionally, of youth that use alcohol once a week, 79.5% report having had intercourse.


Of youth who are never involved in sports, there is a higher proportion (29.3%) that are sexually active than those that are involved in sports often (25.6%) or a lot (23.1%).


What the numbers and other information told us:

The proportion of sexually active youth who are never involved in clubs is almost 12% higher than that of those that are involved in clubs a lot.


Of youth who are never involved in church activities, there is a higher proportion (32.9%) that are sexually active than those that are involved in church activities a lot (20.7%).

The proportion of sexually active youth who are never involved in community activities is 11.8% higher than that of those who are involved in community activities a lot.



What the numbers and other information told us:

In 2018 (the most recent year available at the time of this report), the rate of teen pregnancy among females age 15-17 in Harrisonburg (18.2 per 1,000) was more than double the teen pregnancy rate among females age 15-17 in Virginia (7.7 per 1,000). While rates increased in 2016 and 2017, Harrisonburg teen pregnancy rates decreased slightly in 2018.


In Rockingham County, teen pregnancy rates among females age 15-17 increased slightly from 2017 to 2018, while remaining below the Virginia's overall rate.

What the numbers and other information told us:


In 2019, 15.3% of teens who are sexually active say that they do not use any form of protection, which is a decrease from 2017. There was also a 5.1% increase in the portion of sexually active youth who report using condoms.


While decreasing slightly from 2017 to 2018, the rate of births to teen girls age 15-17 in Harrisonburg (15.1 per 1,000) was nearly triple the birth rate among teen girls age 15-17 in Virginia (5.7 per 1,000). The Rockingham County live birth rate among teen girls increased from 2017 to 2018 (5.5 to 7.6).


While the number of teen pregnancies among Harrisonburg and Rockingham County youth ages 10-17 remained fairly consistent, the number of pregnancies among 18-19 year olds increased after a decreasing trend from 2015 to 2017.

What the numbers and other information told us:

In 2018, the percentage of births to mothers with less than 12th grade education in Harrisonburg (22%) was more than double the percentage for Virginia. The same statistic in Rockingham County is 5% higher than the percentage for Virginia.





What the numbers and other information told us:


The percentage of youth reporting weekly and annual consumption of alcohol decreased slightly from 2017 to 2019, while those reporting daily use (1.4%) and monthly use (12.6%) each increased by 0.1% during that time.


What the numbers and other information told us:

The number of 8th and 10th graders reporting that it is very easy or fairly easy to get alcohol increased slightly (3.6% and 1.2% respectively) from 2017 to 2019, while the number of 12th graders reporting the same decreased by 6.4% from 2017 to 2019.



What the numbers and other information told us:


Only 6.4% of students whose friends disapprove of alcohol use drink at least once per month. Similarly, only 9.3% of youth whose parents disapprove of alcohol use drink at least once per month. These numbers have remained steady since 2017.


What the numbers and other information told us:

A lower proportion of youth (12.8% and 24.8%) who are involved in sports often and a lot used alcohol than those that are never involved in sports (39.5%).


Youth who are never involved in clubs report a higher rate of alcohol use (30.2%) than those that are involved in clubs.


Of youth who participate in church activities a lot, only 19.2% have used alcohol in the past year. This is nearly 12% less than the portion of youth (31.1%) who never participate in church activities that have used alcohol in the past year.

Of youth who are never involved in community activities, there is a higher proportion (36.8%) that used alcohol in the past year than those that are involved in community activities a lot (26.2%).


Tobacco Use 2019

What the numbers and other information told us:


There has been an increase in the overall use of tobacco in all grades from 2017, with the largest increase (3.2%) occurring in monthly use.



The ease of access to all types of tobacco products has increased among all grades.



What the numbers and other information told us:

Overall, 76.6% of youth feel that tobacco is harmful or very harmful – a decrease of 7.7% from 2017. However, 70.7% of youth feel that using e-cigarettes is harmful or very harmful – an increase of 15.7% from 2017 to 2019.




With the exception of weekly use, there were decreases in the frequency of drug use since 2017.


What the numbers and other information told us:




What the numbers and other information told us:

There was a slight increase in the number of 8th graders reporting that it is very easy or fairly easy to get marijuana. However, there was a significant decrease (9%) in the number of 12th graders reporting the same thing.




What the numbers and other information told us:

Of youth whose friends disapprove of marijuana use, only 13.2% used the drug in the past year. Similarly, of youth whose parents disapprove of marijuana use, only 16.8% used the drug in the past year. These numbers compare to the overall portion of youth who have used marijuana in the past year: 20.1%.


Of youth who are never involved in sports, there is a higher proportion (35.1%) that used marijuana in the past year than those that are involved in sports often or a lot (10.8% and 22%).


What the numbers and other information told us:

Of youth who participate in clubs a lot, only 15.8% have used marijuana in the past year. This is 20.9% less than the portion of youth who never participate in clubs and have used marijuana in the past year.

Of youth who participate in church activities a lot, only 12.6% have used marijuana in the past year. This is less than one third of youth (37.4%) who never participate in church activities and have used marijuana in the past year.



What the numbers and other information told us:

Illicit drug use has generally decreased in Harrisonburg City/Rockingham County, with the exception of a slight increase in the reported weekly use of illicit drugs.

The Harrisonburg and Rockingham use of illicit drugs is slightly higher than the national average for monthly and annual use of illicit drugs.




There was an increase in students reporting a fear of being hurt and a slight increase in students who report being hurt at school without a weapon.


There were slight increases in all areas since 2017 for students who reported on violence at school with weapon.

The majority of teens still do not report participating in gang activity. The percentage of youth who report never participating in gang activity increased by 2.6% from 2017 to 2019.





Although most students report they have never been bullied, 10% report having been bullied because of their physical appearance, and 10% have been electronically bullied.








The number of students who report having exercised all seven days of the prior week decreased from 2017 to 2019, and the number of students who report having not exercised at all during that time period increased slightly.



The reported rate at which parents set clear rules increased by 4% and the reported rate at which parents enforce rules increased by 0.7% from 2017 to 2019.



Children of parents who never set rules are less likely to abstain from sex, alcohol use, and marijuana use than children of parents who set rules a lot.


Suicide 2019

What the numbers and other information told us:

In a newly formatted question for the 2019 survey, 17.6% of youth report having ever seriously considered attempting suicide, and 7.2% of youth report that made a plan for attempting suicide in the past 12 months.

What the numbers and other information told us:

In 2019, 9.8% of youth reported they would not tell anyone if their friend was seriously thinking about suicide. This is a slight increase (1.6%) from 2017. Most teens (27.4%) would tell a parent or relative if they were worried about a friend committing suicide.








