### INTRODUCTION

Since the first issue in 1973, the *Statistical Summary* has been updated annually to incorporate the latest information concerning the students, faculty, programs, finances, and facilities of James Madison University. Data were compiled from numerous sources to provide a valuable reference to the university community and beyond. These sources include datasets and reports prepared for state and federal government agencies, reports submitted to private organizations, internal reports produced by university offices, and summaries that were prepared especially for the *Statistical Summary*.

The *Statistical Summary* is also published on the World Wide Web for the 13th year. All tables are posted to give you Internet access as soon as the information is available. We are quite proud to display the photographic talent of JMU students participating in Institutional Research's "Picture-It!" project. Be sure to see their work on the cover page and section dividers of this publication. These students are documenting their JMU experience with pictures and discussing their work in IR sponsored focus groups.

We respond to suggestions to improve the information in the *Statistical Summary*. For the first time in many years, a new section has been added this year: Section VI Alumni. This section has three new tables on employment, income, and graduate education of bachelor's degree completers two years after their graduation. We also added fall off-campus census detail to the historical fall headcount table (Table 2-1).

Some other items of interest are:

- Fall headcount grew by 3.0% or 525 students (Table 2-1).
- The six-year graduation rate increased to 81% for the first time since 1991 (Table 2-25).
- For the first time since fall 1995, both the number and percentage of on-campus males increased (Table 2-2).
- Asian/Pacific Islanders continued to be the largest student minority group with 822 students on- and off-campus (Table 2-7).

The *Statistical Summary* is an example of teamwork at its best. The Institutional Research staff contributed in the following general ways, but everyone pitched in to see the work completed. Dr. Frank Doherty consulted with the Editor. Chuck DeHart edited the document and, with Rosemary Brenner and Barbara Carson-Campbell, compiled and verified the data. 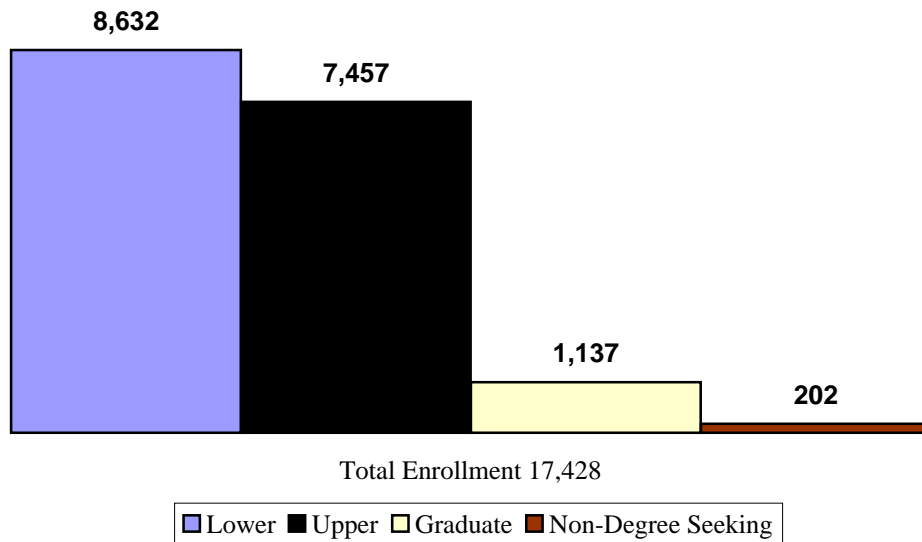

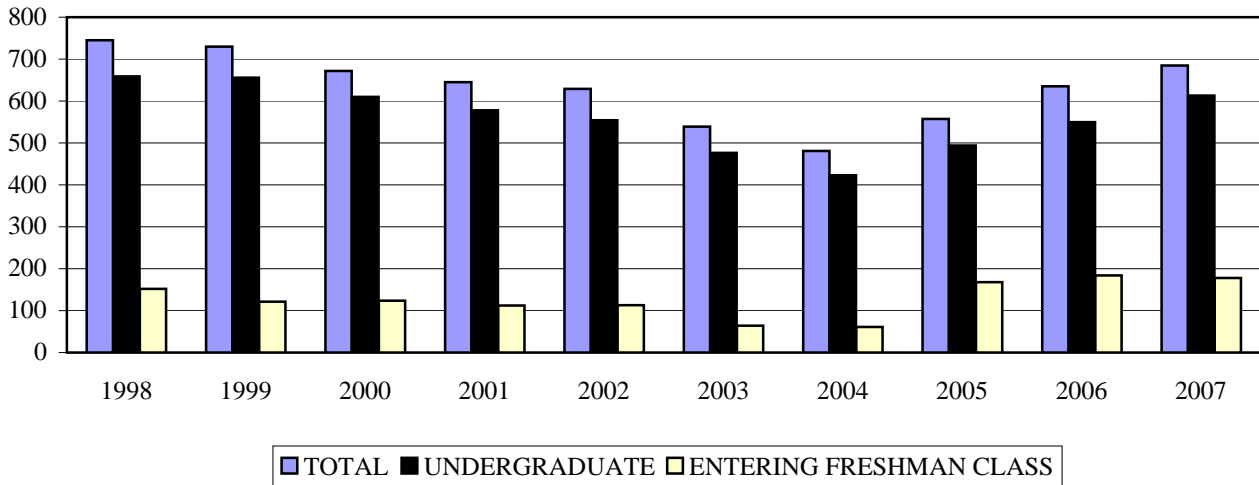

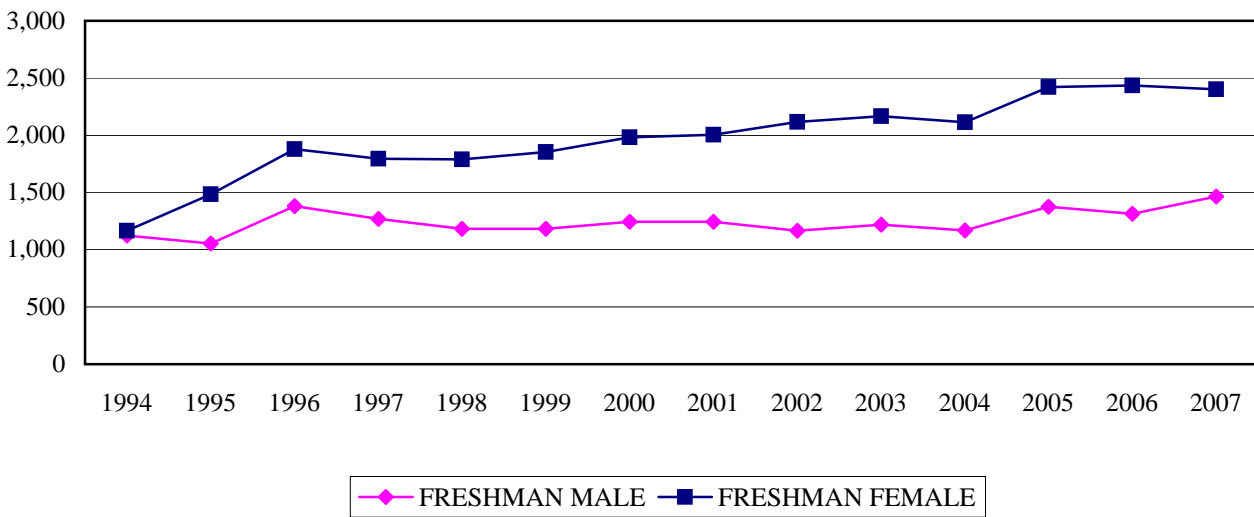
**AFRICAN-AMERICAN STUDENT HEADCOUNT,

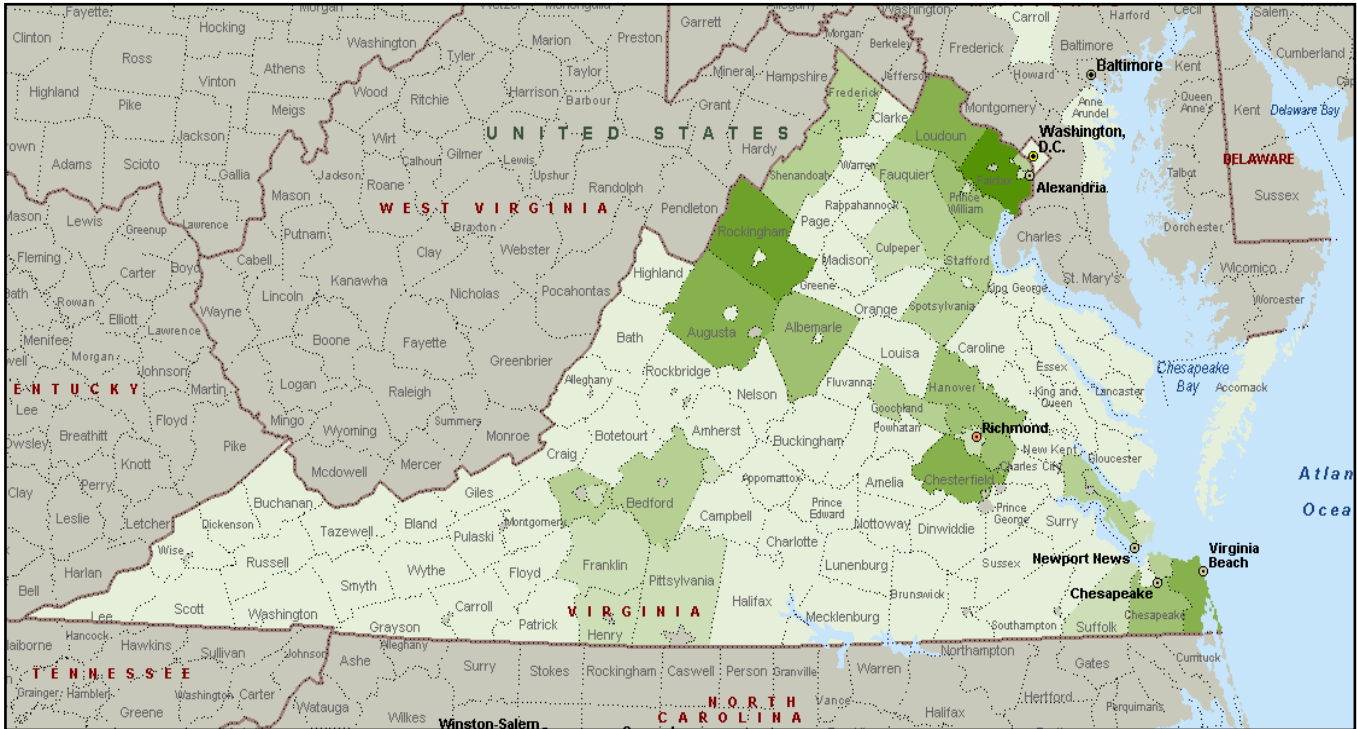

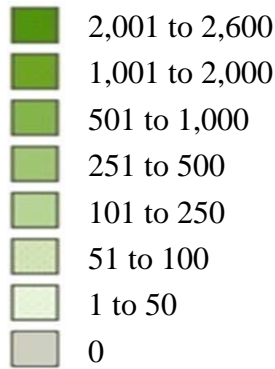

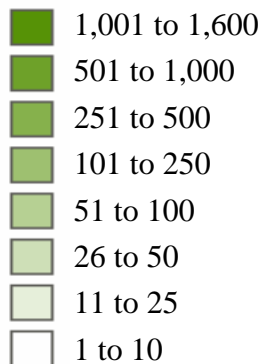

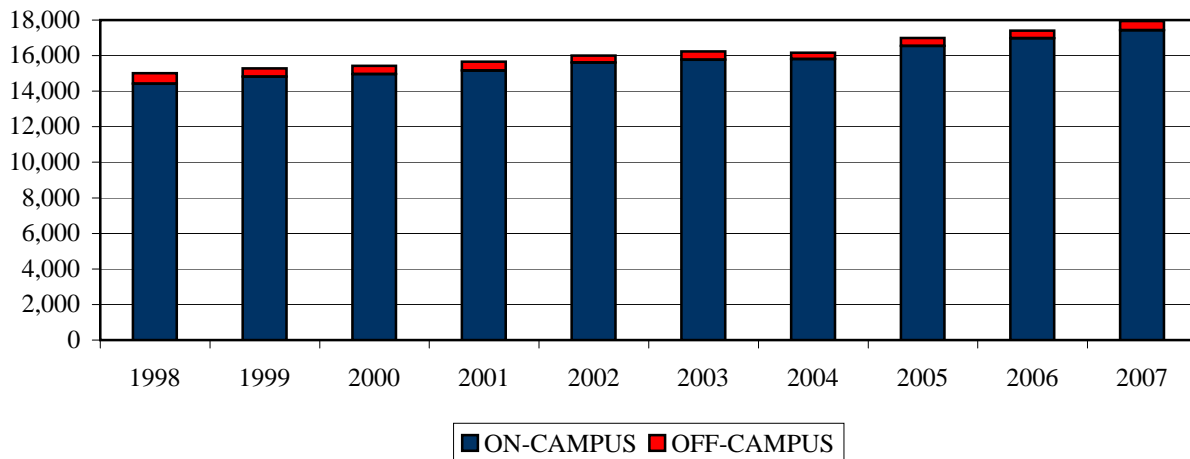

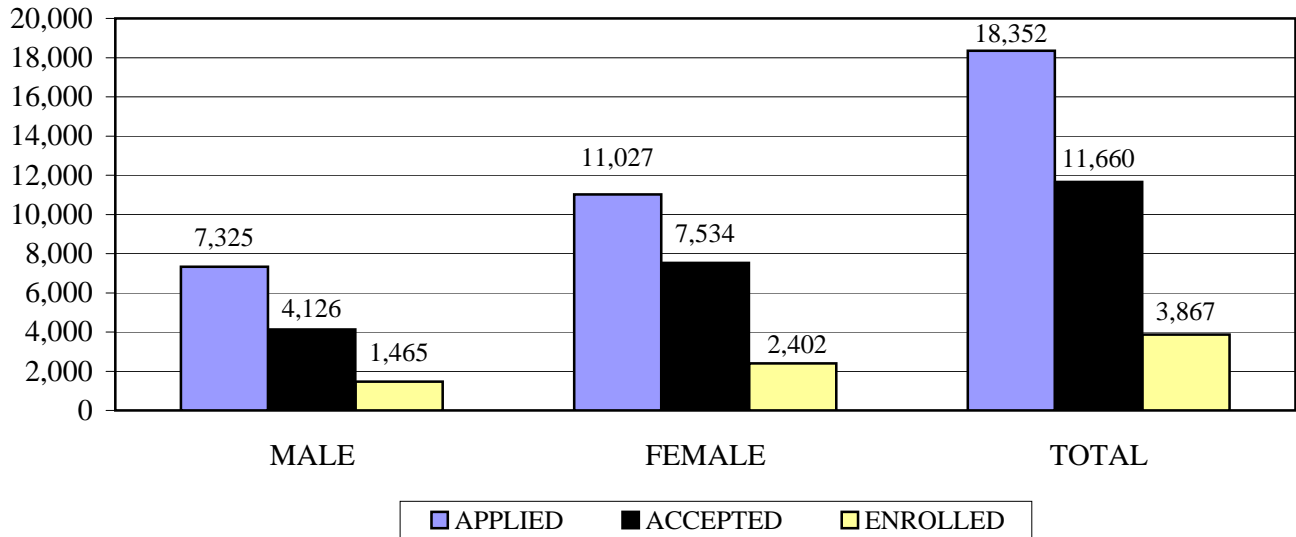

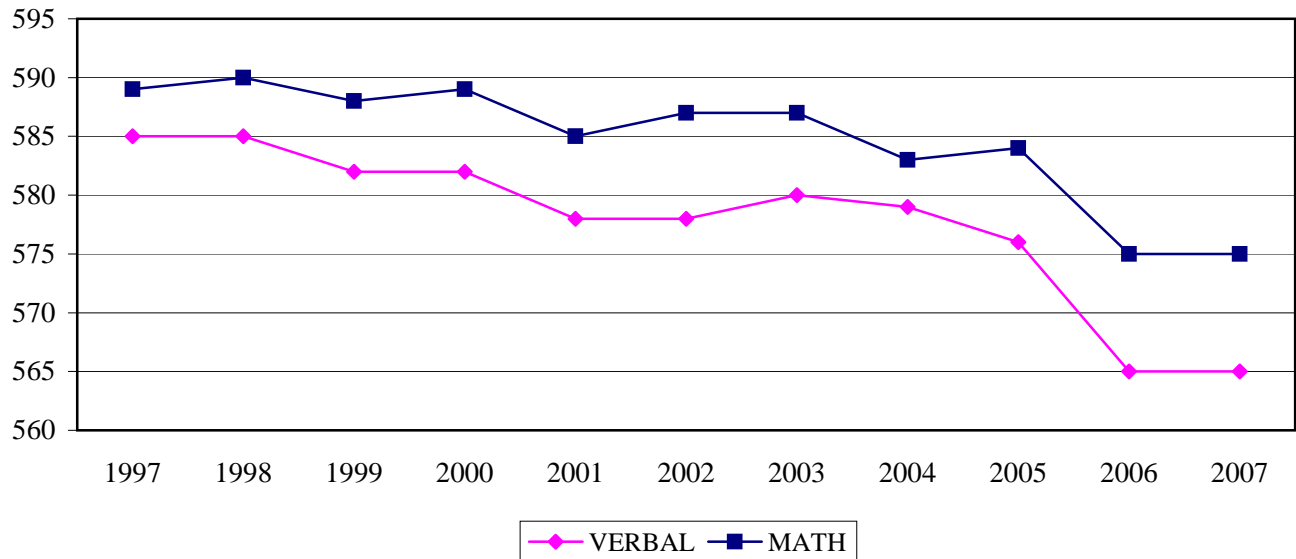
**ENTERING FRESHMAN CLASS APPLICATIONS BY SEX, FALL 2007**

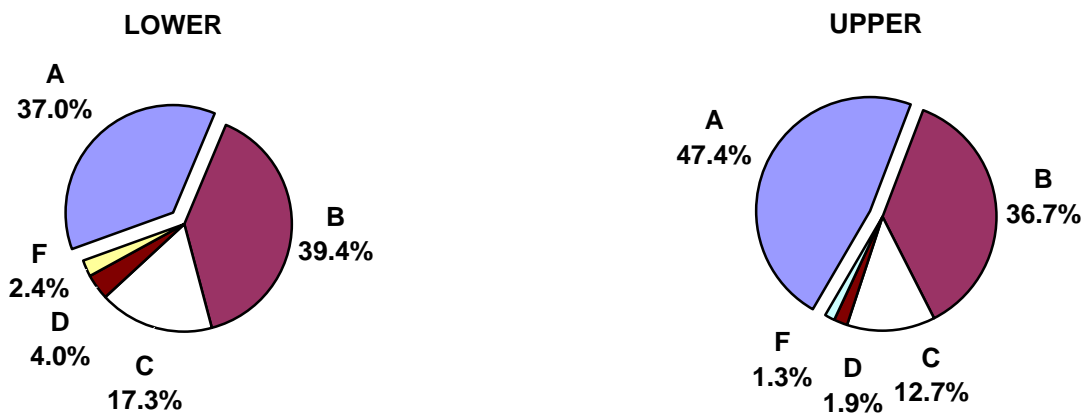

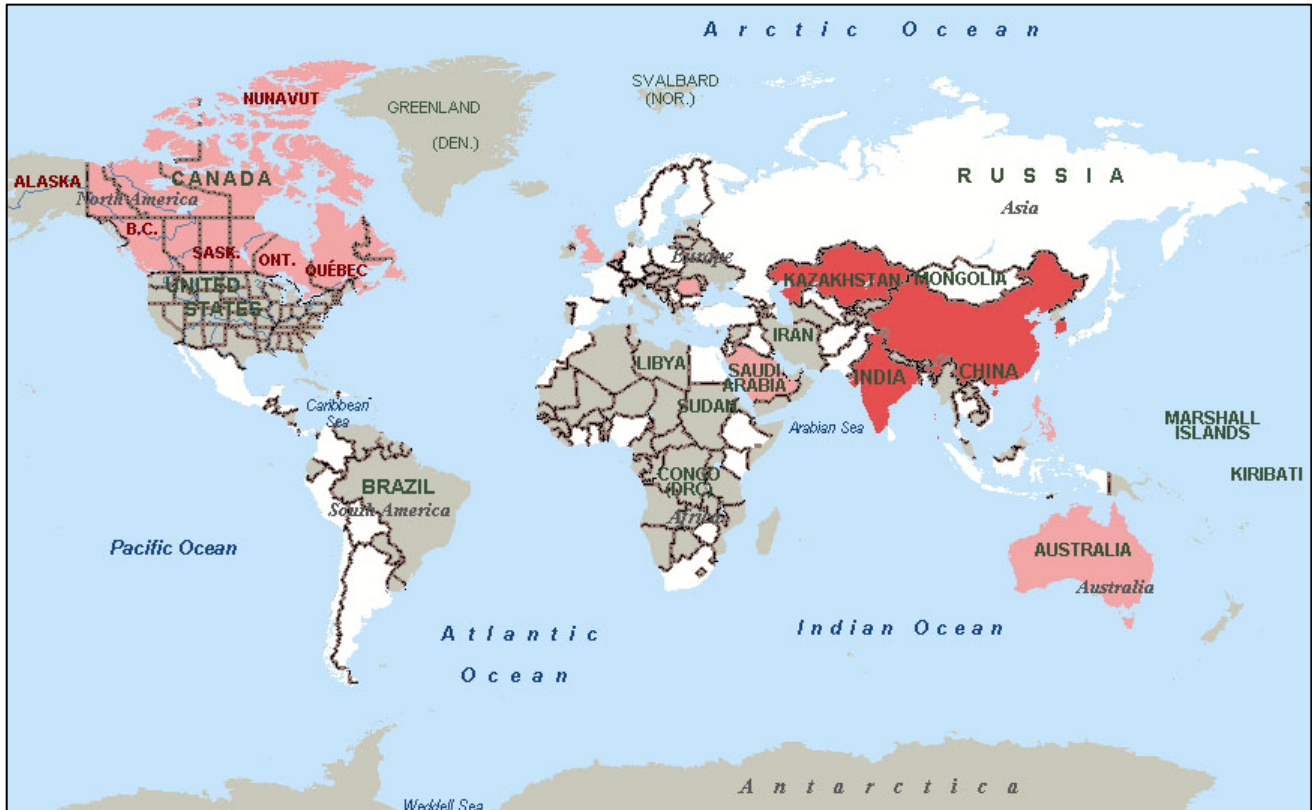

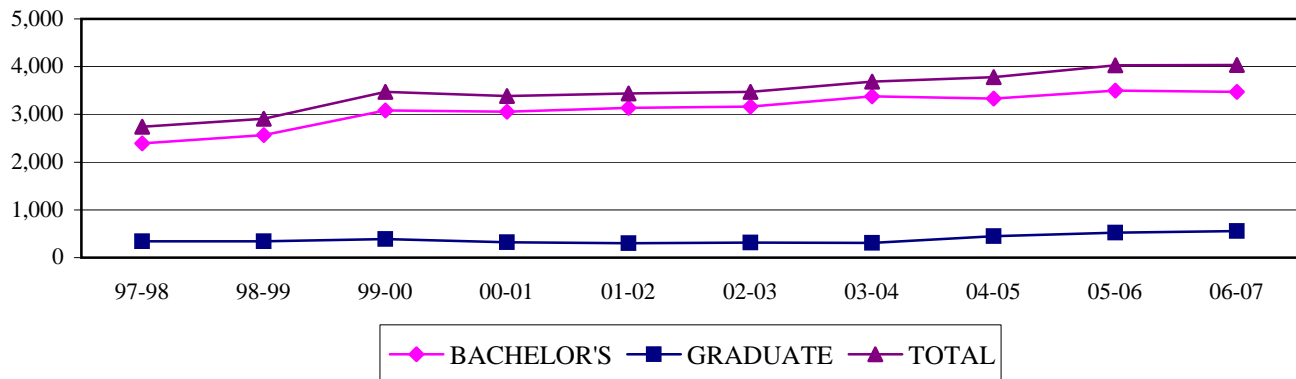

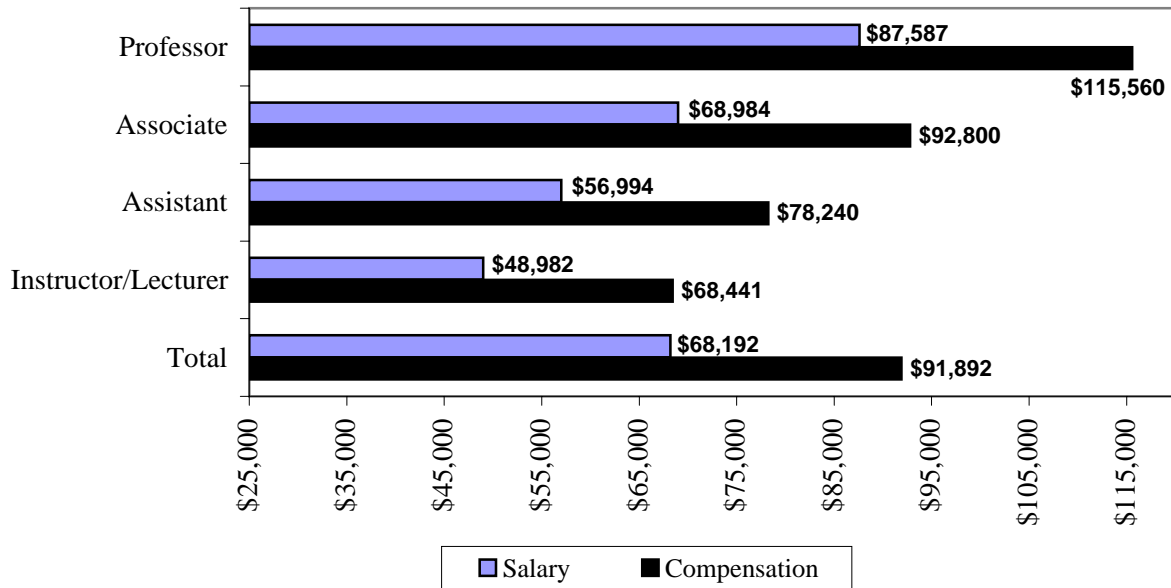

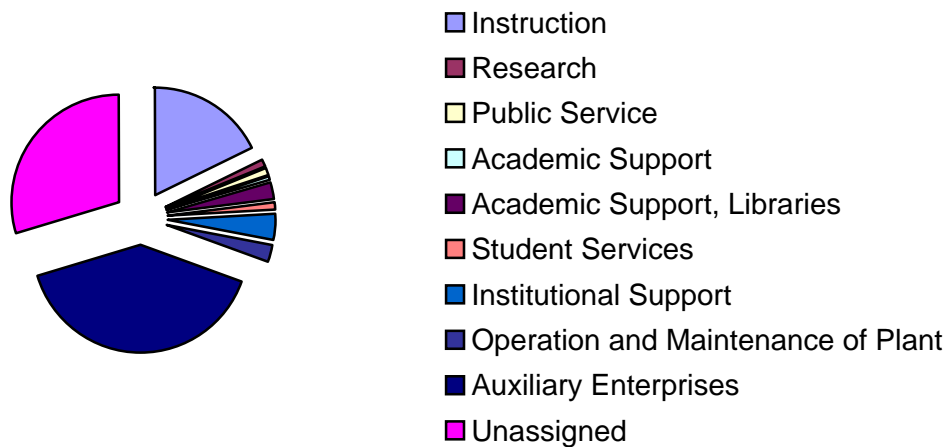

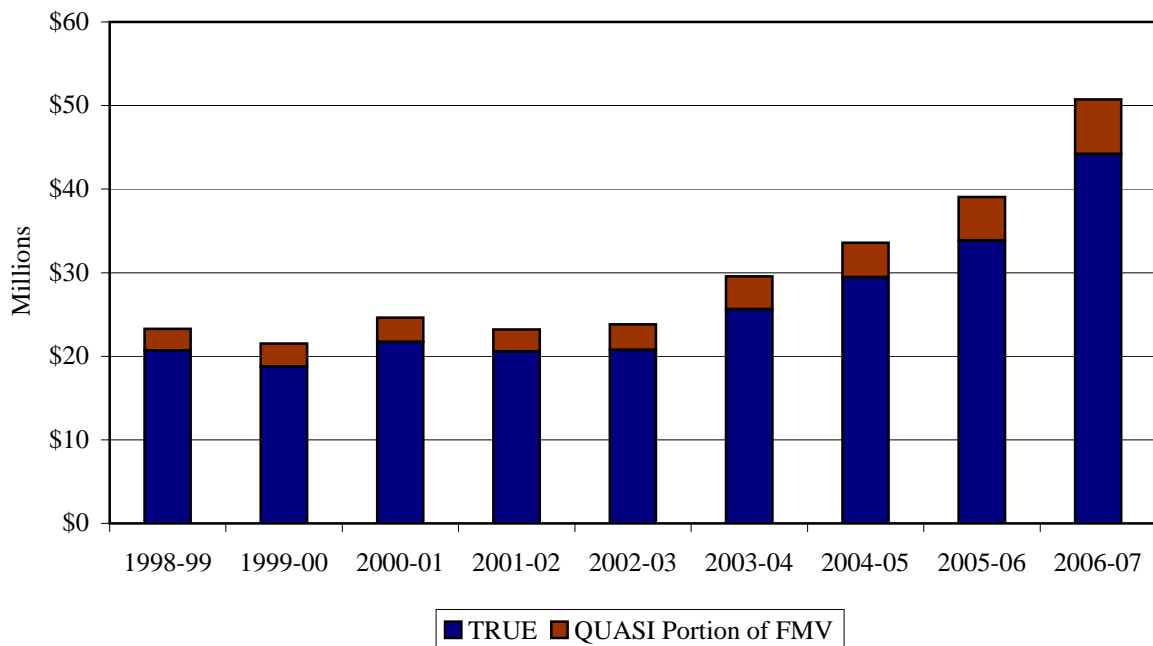
