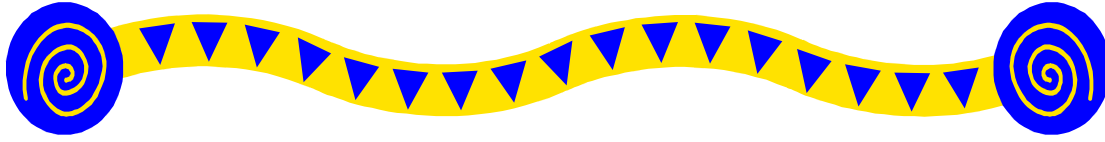

**Bracey, Dorothy and Lieta, Peter. (1975). Longhorn reading scheme. Nairobi, Kenya: Longhorn Publishers (K) Ltd.**

This is a series of 10 readers. The lively stories in the scheme are written in simple English with a carefully controlled vocabulary and appeal to the reader's imagination. A teacher's guide provides lessons and additional material to help with basic skills of word recognition and comprehension through a variety of children's activities.

**Pateman, Robert. (1996). *Cultures of the world: Kenya*. NY: Marshall Cavendish.**

This is a great resource book for an overview of Kenya. Chapters include geography, history, government, economy, environment, Kenyans, lifestyle, religion, language, arts, leisure, festivals, and food.

**Peterson, David. (1998). *Africa: A true book*. NY: Children's Press, a division of Grolier.**

This is an easy-to-read, large print reference for all of Africa.
