

JUSTICE STUDIES SPRING 2012 REGISTRATION NOTES

OVERRIDE POLICY

ALL OVERRIDE REQUESTS MUST BE MADE TO THE DEPARTMENT OFFICE IN PERSON OR VIA EMAIL WITHIN 48 HOURS OF THE CLOSE OF YOUR REGISTRATION TIME SLOT.

CHANGES IN THE MAJOR

The Justice Studies major is undergoing a significant revision. The changes made are designed to increase the interdisciplinarity of the major and address problems of getting into courses in the proper sequence. The important changes are as follows:

1. JUST 200 is a prerequisite for all JUST courses. You must have successfully completed JUST 200 in order to take any other JUST course. JUST 200 may **NOT** be taken during the same semester as any other JUST-designated course. There are no exceptions to this. You may enroll in a 200 level JUST foundation course(s) for the following semester while you are enrolled in JUST 200, but if you fail JUST 200, you may not take other JUST courses until you pass the course.
2. JUST 200 and a track foundation course are requirements for all 300 level courses. You must have completed JUST 200 and have completed or be enrolled in a track foundation course in order to register for JUST 300 level courses for the following semester.
3. All majors must complete 6 elective courses designated for your track. Only **two** of these electives may be non-JUST-designated courses. Four of them must be JUST-designated courses. CRJU courses do not count for track elective credit.
4. JUST 201 is now JUST 399
5. JUST 333 is not a required course for students who are taking JUST 200 in Summer 2011 or later. In its place students will take one foundation course from a track other than the one they are concentrating in. Under the new major JUST 333 is a Track B course.

ALL STUDENTS WHO ARE TAKING JUST 200 IN SUMMER 2011 OR FALL 2011 MUST FOLLOW THE NEW MAJOR. THOSE ALREADY TAKING JUSTICE COURSES SHOULD CONTINUE TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS FROM THE YEAR THEY ENTERED. THE FOLLOWING CHART CAN BE USED AS A GRADUATION CHECKLIST.

Course Notes

Do not sign up for classes if you have not met prerequisites in the course descriptions in the catalog without the permission of the department head. You will be required to drop the classes for which you have not met prerequisites

JUST 100: Advisory

In spite of its low course number this course is geared for juniors and seniors. We focus on resume writing, interviewing skills, looking for internships and looking for jobs. This is an on-line course

JUST 201 is now JUST 399

GJUST 225: Justice in American Society

This is a general education course and does not carry credit in the major.

300 LEVEL TRACK COURSES: Students must take at least 6 elective courses to meet their track requirements. At least 4 of those courses must carry a JUST designator.

JUST 301: Special Topics in Justice Studies Each section of JUST 301 deals with a different topic. See below for information regarding what track the different sections count toward. Students may take multiple sections of JUST 301 and have them count toward meeting their requirements in the major.

- **JUST 301, section 1: (Vollum) The Wire**

This course counts for Track **A and C (updated)**

- **JUST 301, section 2: (Robinson) Sexual Orientation and Social Policy**

This course counts for track **A B and C (updated)**

- **JUST 301, section 3: (Knickrehm) Justice and Development**

This course counts for tracks B & C. It is an on-line course

- **JUST 301, section 4: (Garriott) Police in a Changing World**

This course counts for track A **and B (updated)**

- **JUST 301, section 5: (Bowen) The Combat Solider**

The course will explore direct participation in military combat. It relies primarily on oral history gained from filmed, in person interviews conducted by the instructor with combat veterans. Participants range from World War to the current Middle East conflict. The focus will be the uniquely extraordinary physical, psychological, socio-cultural and spiritual challenges encountered. The course also examines the soldier's reintegration into civilian life. The factor of political climate is analyzed in regard to adjustment while in service, upon returning to society, and longer-term. Guest speakers, documentary film, and readings will contribute to the learning process.

This counts for tracks B and C

- **JUST 301, section 6: (Chakrabardy) Gandhi**

This course counts for track B

JUST 400. Each section examines a different topic in justice studies. The basic structure of the seminar paper is the same in every section. Seminars are not organized around specific tracks. Students may enroll in any section. JUST 201/399 is a prerequisite for enrollment in JUST 400.

Internships

Internship inquiries for the spring should be directed to Dr. Hastedt. Requirements are listed on our web site. Please note that 240 hours of work are required. This can be quite difficult to accomplish in an academic semester. Most students do internships over the summer. An internship is not required for the Justice Studies major

Honors

All students who are doing an honors thesis in the department regardless of what stage in the process they are in or who their advisor is must enroll in JUST 499 A,B or C. The course will meet periodically.
