*MATH 199 is a 1-credit gateway co-requisite designed to assist students who want to start calculus but need to review fundamental mathematics to be successful in MATH 205 or MATH 231. MATH 199 is self-study-based course and the only required meetings will be drop-in proctored test-taking on Friday evenings. Grades are completely determined by the number of semester weeks that pass before the student successfully completes all of the exams. Once the exams are passed the student is no longer required to attend on Friday evenings. Students whose schedules prevent them from attending Friday sessions need to register for MATH 155.

** MATH 233E-234E is an alternative to MATH 231-232 or MATH 235 emphasizing applications in the biological sciences.
