About the JMU Brass Band

Under the direction of Professor Kevin Stees, The JMU Brass Band is one of the most successful collegiate brass bands in the world today. Formed in the Fall of 2000, the band was named the North American Brass Band Association 1st Section Champion in 2004 and 2005, and was the 2006, 2007, 2010, 2016, 2019, and 2022 NABBA Championship Section Runner-up. The group maintains an active schedule, performing regularly throughout the academic year, and has been a featured ensemble at numerous festivals and conferences around the globe. In the summer of 2008, the ensemble embarked on a concert tour of England sharing the stage with many outstanding bands including the No. 1 ranked brass band, Cory Band. In 2009, the group became the first brass band to perform a full-length concert at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C. In 2022, the ensemble was invited to Kerkrade, the Netherlands to represent the United States in the Championship Division of the 19th World Music Contest. Always interested in showcasing new repertoire, the band has given the North American premiere of over a dozen major works for brass band. The JMU Brass Band is currently ranked in the top 100 brass bands worldwide

About Massanutten Brass Band

The Massanutten Brass Band, from Virginia's beautiful Shenandoah Valley, was formed in September of 2001 and has developed a loyal and enthusiastic following of brass band enthusiasts. Now celebrating their 18th season, the ensemble is comprised of outstanding musicians from Northern Virginia, Charlottesville and the Shenandoah Valley. The band's personnel include school band directors, music professors, university music students, and serious amateur musicians. The ensemble performs throughout the central Shenandoah Valley region and has performed as the featured ensemble at the Virginia Music Educators Conference. The Massanutten Brass Band was awarded first prize in the 2nd Section (2007) and third prize in the 1st Section (2009, 2010) at the NABBA Championships. In the Spring of 2011, the band collaborated with the Shenandoah Valley Choral Society in presenting the U.S. premiere of the brass band version of Karl Jenkin's The Armed Man: A Mass for Peace.
