JMU String Project Registration for instrumental lessons on **violin, viola, 'cello, bass, harp or guitar** for returning and new students will be held on **Wednesday, January 25, from 5:00 - 5:45 pm in the Anthony Seeger Hall** auditorium on the corner of Grace and Main Streets. Students of all ages (including adults) are welcome to participate in our group classes and/or private lessons. Information for new students regarding our program and local instrument rental/purchase will be provided at the registration meeting. **Students who pre-registered and paid in the fall for both semesters need not attend the registration** and will receive an email with class details. Please park in the **Warsaw parking deck** for this event (off Main Street and Bluestone Drive).

JMU String Project classes are taught by JMU School of Music undergraduate and graduate students. Classes are held on the JMU campus either in the Anthony-Seeger Auditorium on the corner of Grace and Main Streets, or in the Music Building. Students of all ages (including adults) are welcome to participate. **Group classes** for the spring semester will begin on **Monday, January 30** but students can still complete the **late registration process** up until the end of the second week of our classes.

Group classes are held on Monday's and Wednesday's between either 4:10-4:55 pm or 5:05-5:50 pm (depending on class assignment). The **semester fee** for these lessons is **\$60.00**. Supplemental private lessons are also available for those students wanting additional individual instruction for a cost of \$15.00 per 30-minute lesson for 10 lessons (\$150.00 total). The combined cost for group and private lessons is \$210.00 for the semester. Private lessons are scheduled to fit the individual needs of both the student and private lesson teacher.
