## Who should enroll in this program?

This program is intended for teachers employed in a Virginia school division with a **provisional license in grades 6-12** who are seeking full teacher licensure. This course series is designed to meet the professional studies requirements for alternative licensure in the areas of secondary grades 6-12 endorsement (English, history, biology, etc.). Other areas of provisional licensure, such as special education and elementary education, require additional specific coursework not offered in this series.
