SUSPECT(S): 2 unknown males

1. A black male with some facial hair and short braids, a black cap and baggy cloths.

2. A white male with brown hair approximately 5'9", with some facial hair. Wearing a red & black cap & baggy cloths.

Both Males between 25 and 30 years old.

In compliance with the "Timely Notice" provisions of the federal *Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998* the James Madison University Police Department is giving notice of an alleged armed robbery reported by the Harrisonburg Police Department on Monday, 11-21-2011.

The Harrisonburg Police Department is investigating an armed robbery that took

place this evening around 6:30 p.m.

Police were called to the 1800 block of Putter Court, where two victims reported they

were robbed.

The victims said the offenders entered the residence through an unlocked door,

displayed a firearm, and took electronics and money. Both victims were also assaulted during the incident and suffered minor injuries.

One offender is described as a black male with some facial hair and short braids. He

was last seen wearing a black cap and baggy clothes.

The second offender is described as a white male with brown hair approximately 5'9

with some facial hair. He was last seen wearing a red and black cap and baggy

clothes.

Both offenders were described to be between 25 and 30 years old.

Be particularly cautious about leaving ground level doors and windows unsecured and even individual room and office doors in complexes where multiple occupants have access to common areas inside the perimeter of the residential, administrative and academic facilities. This warning also extends to vehicles. Car windows should be up, car doors should be locked and valuable contents should be secured out of sight.
