Possible Threat to the Community "Your Right to Know" October 30th, 2011

OFFENSE: Armed Robbery

LOCATION: 1200 Block of Devon Lane

TIME: Sunday October 30th, 2011, at approximately 2 AM

SUSPECT(S) 2 unknown black males

1. A black male with black and red hat with a black tank top.

2. A black male with dreadlocks and a "Falcons" hoodie.

In compliance with the "Timely Notice" provisions of the federal *Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998* the James Madison University Police Department is giving notice of an alleged armed robbery reported by the Harrisonburg Police Department on Monday, 10-31-2011.

Oct. 31, 2011

The Harrisonburg Police Department continues investigating an armed robbery that took place on Sunday, October 30.

Around 2 a.m., officers responded to the 1200 block of Devon Lane, where several victims said they were robbed by two unknown males.

Five male victims were outside on the patio of a ground-level apartment, when they were approached by two unknown men.

One offender displayed a handgun and demanded money from the victims. The offender also assaulted a victim, who sustained minor injuries.

The offenders took two wallets and money from the victims, before fleeing in a four door sedan.

One suspect is described as a black male, who was wearing a black and red hat and a black tank top.

The second suspect is described as a black male with dread locks, who was wearing a "Falcons" hoodie.

Be particularly cautious about leaving ground level doors and windows unsecured and even individual room and office doors in complexes where multiple occupants have access to common areas inside the perimeter of the residential, administrative and academic facilities. This warning also extends to

vehicles. Car windows should be up, car doors should be locked and valuable contents should be secured out of sight.
