SUSPECT(S): Unknown White Male

In compliance with the "Timely Notice" provisions of the federal *Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998* the James Madison University Police Department is giving notice of an alleged rape reported on Tuesday, 09-04-2012.

The Harrisonburg Police Department advised on this date that they are continuing to investigate a report of an alleged Forcible Rape that occurred during the late night of Friday 08/31/2012 and early morning of Saturday 09/01/2012 in the City of Harrisonburg.

"The female victim (19 years old) was at a residence in the 1400 block of Devon Lane when she was assaulted by an unknown white male. The incident occurred sometime between Friday, Aug. 31 around 11 p.m. and Saturday, Sept. 1 around 12:45 a.m.

Investigators continue working this case and following up with the victim to obtain more information about the incident.

At this point in the investigation, there does not appear to be an immediate threat to the public. The Department always encourages residents to be mindful of their personal safety and report any suspicious activity to police."
