## Indecent Exposure – JMU PD #2011- 14723 TIMELY NOTIFICATION BULLETIN

Possible Threat to the Community "Your Right to Know" August 20th, 2011

**OFFENSE:** Indecent Exposure

LOCATION: Greek Row Entrance

TIME: Saturday, August 20th 2011 at approximately 1:30 pm

**SUSPECT(S)** An unknown white male, 6ft tall, 35 - 40 years old, 180 - 190 lbs. Wearing a red shirt, black shorts, athletic shoes with short white socks, and a ball cap.

In compliance with the "Timely Notice" provisions of the federal *Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1998* the James Madison University Police Department is giving notice of an incident involving an alleged indecent exposure that occurred in the vicinity of Greek Row.

On Saturday, August 20th, at about 1:30 pm, an unknown white male was observed in the area of Greek Row by two witnesses who were in the area together. They reported the unknown male was exposing himself. The male was described as 6ft tall, between the ages of 35-40 years old, 180 - 190 lbs. with an athletic build. He was wearing a red shirt, black shorts, athletic shoes with short socks and a ball cap. When he saw one of the victims on their cell phone, he fled towards Hillcrest Ave.

JMU and the City of Harrisonburg want to encourage everyone in the Community to exercise good crime prevention strategies all the time and to make these good daily habits. Close and lock all exterior doors and windows at night and anytime the area is left unattended whether it be for 5 minutes or 5 days to go to class, go to the store, visit a friend or leave town for the holiday. Be particularly cautious about leaving ground level doors and windows unsecured and even individual room and office doors in complexes where multiple occupants have access to common areas inside the perimeter of the residential, administrative and academic facilities. This warning also extends to vehicles. Car windows should be up, car doors should be locked and valuable contents should be secured out of sight.
