

**Greene and Madison County Tour of
Two Beachy Amish Communities
Led by Harvey Yoder
Saturday, October 10, 2009**

Join one of LLI's most popular course leaders as he introduces us to some quiet folks who have accomplished some remarkable things. At Faith Mission Home, located at a former Episcopal mission high on the eastern side of the Blue Ridge, handicapped children and young adults receive care with no government help. Mountain View Nursing Home near Aroda, in Madison County, is a modern facility that offers nursing and assisted living care for over 20 seniors. It is sponsored by a single congregation of fewer than 150 members, but like Faith Mission Home, benefits from having dozens of young adult volunteers from all over the eastern United States.

This trip includes the following:

- Round-trip motor coach transportation
- Dinner with tax and gratuity included
- Entrance into all sites

Price per person (minimum of 30 persons) is \$35.00. Reservation and payment is due by September 18, 2009. There are no seating assignments on the bus. No refunds after September 18, 2009.

2:45-3:15	Yoder's Country Market near Aroda (a lot like the Cheese Shop at Stuarts Draft), operated by Owen Yoder
3:15-4:00	Mountain View Nursing Home
4:15-5:00	Oak Grove (Beachy Amish) Mennonite Church and church school
5:00-6:00	Evening meal at the church, with special music provided by members of the congregation
6:15 pm	Departure for hour-long return trip to Harrisonburg

As approved by the Advisory Board, if space is available 21 days before a trip, Lifelong Learning Institute members may bring one non-member guest at the cost of the trip **plus an additional \$5.00. This additional \$5.00 check should be made payable to James Madison University. Non-member guests can pay a one-year membership for \$15.00, plus the cost of the trip, and not have to wait until 21 days before a trip.**

Responsibility on Tours and Class Trips: The tours and class-associated field trips of the JMU-LLI require walking and the physical capability to access sites that may have structural obstacles. By participating, members understand that should they require personal assistance to participate in tours/field trips, they are responsible for securing such assistance. That responsibility includes registering a person with Lifelong Learning Institute who can and will be totally responsible for providing all assistance. That person must register as a member and pay the cost of the tour/trip.
