



Fiscal Year 2022 Annual Report

Research & Scholarship — James Madison University Office of Sponsored Programs

I. SUMMARY OF ACTIVITY

A. Funding Overview

Sponsored programs activity at the university exponentially increased during fiscal year 2022 (FY22), up by 39% in terms of total dollars in just one year. A higher volume of funding applications and awards, led to external funding totals of \$31,771,193 during the reporting period. The effects of the COVID-19 pandemic were evident as CARES Act and American Rescue Plan Act funds received accounted for 6 awards and \$2,351,675.

Proposals submitted increased by 26 to 280, a 10% increase, compared to the prior year and awards received (181) increased by 10 over the previous year by 6%. The increase in both applications and awards may be reflective of the university's recent move to R2 research-intensive status though it is confirmed that awards are becoming larger in dollar value but with fewer small applications and awards.

JMU faculty, students, and staff submitted an array of funding applications, many interdisciplinary in focus or involving collaborations with outside organizations. The following charts reflect the volume of proposals and awards during the previous five-year period and funding trends over 10 years.




Figure 2. 10-year funding history

B. Funding Agencies




Figure 3. Awards by Sponsor Sector

Figure 3 illustrates funding received by sponsor type in FY22 to support research, instruction, public service & outreach, and many other activities at JMU. Of the 181 awards received in FY22, the majority in both number and total award amount came from the federal government either as direct assistance or as flow-through to the university from Virginia state agencies and other universities. Federal support represented 71% of total support in FY22 of the total awards at \$22,644,518, growing steadily over the past 5 years and up 32% over FY21 levels. Combined federal and state funds represented 77% of total funding. JMU's funding portfolio continues to rely very heavily on federal or federal pass through funding.

I. Federal

Awards from the federal government exceeded \$22 million of the total amount received in FY22, a large increase in federal funding from FY21. Again, this fiscal year the US Department of Health and Human Services was the primary sponsor of funded projects in terms of total dollars at \$11,853,767, supporting 27 awards. This is a 62% increase over the prior year and represents 52% of all federal funding received.



The US Department of Education was the second largest funder with 20 projects valued at \$5,408,128, or 24% of all federal funding.

The National Science Foundation was the third largest federal funder in FY22 at \$2,499,320 for 12 projects this fiscal year down just slightly from last fiscal year.

The US Department of State was the fourth largest sponsor this fiscal year, renewing funding for 2 projects with total value of \$981,796 compared to \$760,032 in FY21.

The Small Business Administration funded 4 projects valued at \$580,280.

Other sources of federal funding were 12 funded projects from the Forest Service, National Park Service, Office of Naval Research, US Department of Energy, the US Geological Survey, the National Endowment for the Arts, and NASA.

II. State



In FY22, Commonwealth of Virginia agencies slightly increased direct funding by with 13 projects worth \$1,976,466. It is important to note that state agencies channeled significant federal funding to the university in the form of pass-through awards. These totals are captured under the federal totals since the federal government is the ultimate source of the funding. The Virginia Department of Education and the Virginia Department of Health comprised the largest percentage of total state contributions towards externally funded projects at the university but ongoing projects were also funded by the Virginia Department of Social Services and the Virginia Department of Mines, Minerals and Energy.

III. Private/Non-Profit

Private/Non-Profit agencies provided 43 awards in FY22 totaling \$3,467,732 compared to \$2,691,835 in FY21. This represents 11% of total funding.




Figure 4. Private/Non- Profit Funding

IV. Foundations

Foundation sponsorship increased sharply this year at \$2,803,752 compared to \$432,280 in FY21. This year, the university received 22 awards from a diverse range of foundations, including the Charles Stewart Mott Foundation, the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, the American Academy of Audiology Foundation, the Dominion Foundation, the Claude Moore Charitable Foundation, the Kern Family Foundation, the Petroleum Research Fund, and the Leakey Foundation. The largest source of funding was the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation which funded a large libraries grant for \$2,000,000.




Figure 5. Foundation Support

V. Industry




Figure 6. Industry Funding

Funding from industry continues to represent less than 1% of total funding received. Industry sponsors supported just 1 project valued at \$175,000 versus 3 in FY21. Funding from the Industry sector fluctuates but has not become a significant area of focus for faculty members, staff and students.

VI. Other

University and Virginia City/County sponsors contributed a total of \$703,727 during FY22 compared to \$1,179,419 received during FY21. Though this is a fraction of the total award dollars, it represents 21 projects at the University. These sources of funding afford many students with hands-on experiences.

VII. COVID/CARES ACT/American Rescue Plan Act Stabilization Funding

The University received 6 awards in FY22 totaling \$2,351,675 in support of direct programming and testing related to impacts from the COVID-19 pandemic including flow-through funding from the Health Resources and Services Administration through the Virginia Department of Health, the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, the Virginia Early Childcare Foundation and the US Small Business Administration. This is an increase of 177% over last year's COVID related funding of \$849,500. The Office of Sponsored Programs also continued to assist the Finance division in receiving CARES ACT Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) and the Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER) funding support for student financial aid.

C. External Funding Activity by College or University Division

Awards obtained by JMU faculty and staff range in type, including research, public service/outreach, continuing education, and instruction. Collaborative activity involving multidisciplinary projects, interinstitutional collaborations, and private and industry partnerships continues to be central to the proposal development process.




Figure 7. College and Division Funding

D. Awards by Activity Type

Funding received is categorized by predominate activity type. Again, this fiscal year **Public Service & Outreach** represents the most robust area of funding with 84 awards. **Research** activity involves 57 projects. **Instruction** represents 18 projects. **Academic Support** types of activity represent 3 projects. **Institutional Support** comprises 4 projects. This fiscal year JMU received 15 projects categorized as **Student Service**.




Figure 8. Awards by Activity Type

E. Faculty Assistance/Metrics

The primary focus of OSP Administrative Services (OSPAS) (formerly pre-award) staff activity is assisting principal investigators in preparing budgets and funding applications to sponsors. Additionally a significant amount of time goes to receiving and negotiating funding instruments from sponsors and other organizations and preparing subaward agreements to other entities. Staff also spends time monitoring subrecipients and preparing budget revisions and no-cost extension requests for sponsor approvals at the post-award stage. Much time is devoted to compliance activities, project close-out and report monitoring. Additionally, numerous miscellaneous agreements flow through the office for review and negotiation on behalf of faculty members and the university. These are often agreements to facilitate proposed or funded projects such as Material Transfer Agreements, Non-Disclosure Agreements, Teaming Agreements, Memorandums of Agreement and Entity Agreements.

The OSP Financial Services (OSPFS) side of the operation receives the hand off of projects at the point of award and sets up new awards in all university systems, Finance, HR, and Procurement. The staff administers financial transactions, monitors expenses, performs all financial reporting and invoices a wide variety of sponsors. Personnel also prepare drawdowns from federal sponsors in tandem with the University Business Office. Significant time is spent advising principal investigators and fiscal technicians across the university on how to prepare transactions such as Agency Transaction Vouchers.

All Personnel Action Request Forms which are associated with external funding flow through OSPFS for review and approval. The monthly allocation of recovered indirect costs is performed by OSPFS. Daily tasks include eVA approvals on sponsored programs, Chrome River travel reimbursement requests, and tracking of Accounts Receivables related to sponsored programs.

F. Unit Initiatives & Successes

In addition to daily processing and faculty and staff interactions, which directly support funding applications, a lot of effort is focused on building collaborations, goodwill and relationships within the grant-seeking community. Following are highlights of new or ongoing initiatives rolled out this past year that were designed to increase a diversified funding portfolio, celebrate and recognize external funding activity and introduce efficiencies in central support operations.

Noftsinger Celebration of Madison Scholarship and Annual Office of Sponsored Programs Recognition Reception

Along with Research Development, the OSP work group planned and assisted with the in-person Recognition Reception to honor all individuals who either applied for or received external funding in the prior fiscal year.

OUTREACH AND EDUCATION:

CFI's Faculty Welcome Information Session – the Associate Director attended this session in Rose Library to represent the office.

CFI Faculty Welcome session – *Supporting your Research, Scholarship, and Creative Endeavors (Online Roundtable)* The Director participated in the welcome for new faculty in August 2021 and provided an overview of the Office of Sponsored Programs' services.

Grant Writing Lab

The Director worked with the Director of Strategic Research Support to develop and deliver a segment on the Office of Sponsored Programs within the Grant Writing Lab to faculty from the College of Education in January 2022.

Talent Development: Grant Proposal Groundwork (TD2354) (2 hours) and Grant Proposal: Building a Budget (TD2355) (2 hours) were facilitated by the Director.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

All OSP staff are committed to professional development. During the cycle staff participated in the following professional conferences and facilitated professional training for others in the profession:

Society of Research Administrators International Annual Meeting – New Orleans, LA..

The Director was recruited to participate on a panel session at the SRAI national meeting entitled "Is Anyone Listening? Managing Relationships Across the Grant Life-Cycle"

VA-SRA Meeting – June 3, 2022 at Virginia Tech. The Director and Associate Director attended.

National Council of University Research Administrators (NCURA): The OSP Director applied for and was accepted into the inaugural cohort of NCURA **EMERGE program**. The program provided a conduit for NCURA members to have equitable access for opportunities to develop as inclusive leaders. Over 6 months the program engaged participants to grow personally and professionally while collaborating with a diverse group of peers. The national program was by application and invitation only.

Director completed the 16th IMPACT cohort for leadership development at JMU during this review period. It was a significant dedication of time.
