



# Fiscal Year 2023 Annual Report

Research & Scholarship — James Madison University Office of Sponsored Programs

## I. SUMMARY OF ACTIVITY


## A. Funding Overview

Sponsored programs activity at the University increased substantially during fiscal year 2023 (FY23) in terms of total dollars from \$31,771,193 in fiscal year 2022 to \$34,158,733, nearly a 7.5% gain. Roughly the same number of individuals were involved in seeking and securing external funds. During the year, 145 individuals received external funding to promote research, instruction, outreach, and other types of externally funded activities on campus.

Funding applications submitted increased by 4% (or 21) to 290 versus 280 the prior year and awards received (202) increased 12% over the prior year (181). External funds received in FY23 increased by \$2,387,580 compared to FY22. Funding requested was \$125,334,710 vs. \$96,600,944 in FY22.

JMU faculty, students, and staff submitted an array of funding applications, many interdisciplinary in focus or involving collaborations with other organizations. The following charts reflect the volume of proposals and awards during the previous five-year period and funding trends over 10 years.







## **B.** Funding Agencies




Figure 3. Awards by Sponsor Sector

Figure 3 illustrates funding received by sponsor type during FY23 to support a variety of research, instruction, public service & outreach, and other projects at JMU. Of the 202 awards received in FY23, the majority in both number and total award amount came from the federal government either as direct assistance or as flow-through to the University from Virginia state agencies and other universities. Similar to prior years, combined federal and state funds represented 83% of total support in FY23 of the total awards at \$28,370,958. JMU's external funding portfolio continues to rely very heavily on federal and federal pass through funding.

#### I. Federal

Awards from the federal government decreased slightly to \$22,186,284 during FY23 compared to \$22,644,518 received in FY22, or a 2% decrease in federal funding over the prior year. Again, this fiscal year Public Health Service agencies within the US Department of Health and Human Services were the primary sponsor of federally funded projects in terms of total dollars at \$9,885,157, supporting 23 awards. This represents a 17% decrease compared to FY22 and is 45% of all federal funding received.

The National Science Foundation (NSF) was the second largest federal funder in FY23 at \$4,832,549 compared to \$2,499,320 for 14 projects funded in FY22. This represents a healthy 93% increase in total funding from NSF over FY22 levels.

The US Department of Education was the third largest federal funder with \$3,718,411, which funded 19 projects. New this year to the funding portfolio are two TRIO projects which create necessary avenues for students from disadvantaged backgrounds to succeed in post-secondary education. The TRIO Talent Search Project serves low-income, first-generation college students attending four target schools in Rockingham County who have the potential to pursue higher education. The TRIO Upward Bound program seeks to give program participants the skills and motivation necessary to enter and succeed in a program of postsecondary education.

The US Department of State was the fourth largest sponsor this fiscal year, providing continuation funding of 3 projects with a total value of \$1,052,441 consistent with FY22 levels.

The US Department of Energy was the fifth largest funder with 5 projects valued at \$741,512, or 3% of all federal funding.

Other federal agencies funded 5 proposals worth \$1,351,073, including: US Small Business Administration, Institute of International Education, US Geological Survey, US Department of Justice, Department of Defense, and NASA.

#### II. State



In FY23, Commonwealth of Virginia agencies increased direct funding with 20 projects worth \$6,184,674 compared to \$1,976,466 in FY22, or 18% of total funding received. It is important to note that state agencies channeled significant federal funding to the University in the form of pass-through awards. These totals are captured under the federal totals since the federal government is the ultimate source of the funding. The Virginia Department of Education and the Virginia Department of Health comprised the largest percentage of total state contributions towards externally funded projects at the University. Other significant ongoing projects were also funded by the Virginia Department of Social Services and the

State Council of Higher Education for Virginia (SCHEV).

#### III. Private/Non-Profit

Private/Non-Profit agencies provided 55 awards compared to 43 awards in FY22 totaling \$3,660,040 compared to \$3,467,732 in FY22. This represents 2% of total funding for the year. After federal funding agencies, private organizations fund the most projects at JMU.





Figure 4. Private/Non-Profit Funding

#### IV. Foundations

Foundation sponsorship significantly decreased this year at \$536,067 from 20 sponsors versus \$2,803,752 received from 22 foundation sponsors in FY22. This year, the University received awards from a diverse range of foundations, including the Charles Stewart Mott Foundation, the American Academy of Audiology Foundation, the Dominion Foundation, the Claude Moore Charitable Foundation, the Leakey Foundation, the Camille and Henry Dreyfus Foundation, the Kern Family Foundation, and the Claude Moore Charitable Foundation.

#### V. Industry

Awards from Industry sponsors increased 119% in FY23 to \$382,498 to support 5 projects compared to \$175,000 from just one corporate sponsor in FY22. Funding received supported 5 projects. Funding from industry represents just over 1% of total funding received. Though funding from the Industry sector fluctuates, entrepreneurial activity is a significant area for providing students valuable hands-on experiences as principal investigators explore collaborations with their business counterparts.

## VI. Other Sponsors

University and Virginia City/County sponsors funded 26 projects totaling \$1,209,170 of the total funding received during FY23. Though this is just 4% of the total award dollars, it represents a broad variety of projects at the University.

## C. External Funding Activity by College or University Division

The awards obtained by JMU faculty and staff range in type, including: Academic Support Institutional Support, Instruction, Student Service and Research. Collaborative activity involving multidisciplinary projects, inter-institutional collaborations, and private and industry partnerships continue to be central to the proposal development process.




Figure 7. College and Division Funding

## D. Awards by Activity Type




Figure 8. Awards by Activity Type

Funding received is categorized by predominate activity type (Figure 8). Again, this fiscal year *Public Service & Outreach* represents the most robust area of funding with 100 awards. *Research* activity involves 69 projects. *Instruction* represents 15 projects. *Academic Support* types of activity represent 2 projects. *Institutional Support* comprises 2 projects. This fiscal year JMU received 14 projects categorized as *Student Service*. Notably, the number of *Research* sector projects funded increased dramatically (21%) over the previous 2 years with numerous students supported.

## E. Faculty Assistance/Metrics

The primary focus of OSP Administrative Services (OSPAS) staff activity is assisting principal investigators in preparing budgets and funding applications to sponsors. Additionally, a significant amount of time goes to receiving and negotiating funding instruments from sponsors and other organizations and preparing subaward agreements to other entities. Staff also spends time monitoring subrecipients and preparing budget revisions and no-cost extension requests for sponsor approvals at the post-award stage. Much time is devoted to compliance activities, project close-out and report monitoring. Additionally, numerous miscellaneous agreements flow through the office for review and negotiation on behalf of faculty members and the University. These are often agreements to facilitate proposed or funded projects such as Material Transfer Agreements, Non-Disclosure Agreements, Teaming Agreements, Memorandums of Agreement and Entity Agreements.

The OSP Financial Services (OSPFS) side of the operation receives the hand off of projects at the point of award and sets up new awards in all university systems, Finance, HR, and Procurement. The staff administers financial transactions, monitors expenses, performs all financial reporting and invoices a wide variety of sponsors. Personnel also prepare drawdowns from federal sponsors in tandem with the University Business Office. Significant time is spent advising principal investigators and fiscal technicians across the University on how to prepare transactions, such as Agency Transaction Vouchers. All Personnel Action Request Forms and Financial Scholarship Forms which are associated with external funding flow through OSPFS for review and approval. The monthly allocation of recovered indirect costs is performed by OSPFS. Daily tasks include eVA approvals on sponsored programs, Chrome River travel reimbursement requests, and tracking of Accounts Receivables related to sponsored programs.

Notably, since the combination of the units in Fall 2020, metrics for nearly every activity have exponentially increased across the work unit, thus justifying the need for 2 new FTE's during the fiscal year. In fact, in just one year contact hours with faculty increased 172% over the prior year, due largely to proposal planning, award negotiation, and acceptance of increasingly more complex awards.

#### F. Unit Initiatives & Successes

In addition to daily processing and faculty and staff interactions which directly support funding applications and award management, significant staff time is devoted to building collaborations with other JMU work groups and establishing goodwill and maintaining relationships within the grant-seeking community. Following is a summary of ongoing activities and new initiatives rolled out this past year which were designed to increase a diversified funding portfolio, celebrate and recognize external funding activity, and introduce efficiencies in central support operations.

# Noftsinger Celebration of Madison Scholarship and Fourth Annual Office of Sponsored Programs Recognition Reception

Along with Research Development, the OSP work group participated in the annual OSP Recognition Reception to honor all individuals who either applied for or received external funding in fiscal year 2023.

**Fall 2022: Retooled Shadow System:** The OSPAS unit positively impacted the workflow by retooling our database Excel shadow system and updating the corresponding instructions and checklists. The redesign of the shadow system added pivot tables and removed duplicate data entry fields and tabs. The upgrade now includes sorting functions and summary fields which significantly improved the monthly balancing process.

**Fall 2022: Payroll Inquiries:** OSP gained access from Finance to view payroll information via queries so the team can quickly calculate fringe benefits on funding applications without going through another unit.

January 2023: Expanded Outreach: OSPFS planned and held the first REU User Group Meeting. Our campus holds 4 National Science Foundation Research Experiences for Undergraduate (REU) programs all housed with the College of Science and Mathematics (CSM). OSP convened the PI's and Co-PI's for all (4) REU's at Foundation Hall to enjoy refreshments and discuss best practices and pain points and to suggest ways to standardize and streamline renewal applications in summer of 2023. The meeting was well received by attendees and CSM recommends holding a yearly gathering to cover issues. Out of the needs identified at the REU meeting OSP was able to secure free parking from Parking Services for the summer for REU participants, one of the identified barriers to smooth operations of the REU programs.

#### **OUTREACH AND EDUCATION:**

#### **New Faculty Orientation**

In August 2022, the Associate Director and Assistant Director participated in the welcome for new faculty to represent the office to new and returning faculty.

Associate Director: Presentation - R&S - Supporting Your Research, Scholarship, and Creative Endeavors

Director: Office of Sponsored Programs Basics to the PhD students in CSD 862

#### **Grants Training through Talent Development**

Talent Development: Organizational Methods to the Leadership Series attendees (July 2022) Grant Proposal Groundwork (TD2354) (2 hours) and Grant Proposal: Building a Budget (TD2355) (2 hours) were facilitated by the Director.

Assistant Director: Procurement Training Course and Grants Post-Award Practices (TD1502) (twice) were delivered by the Assistant Director. This is an ongoing annual commitment to deliver training.

Assistant Director: all new principal investigators are offered an in-person training on financial management with each new award. This service has been well-received by PI's and departmental administrators, many of whom are new to their positions.

**College of Arts and Letters** - The Director participated in a session geared toward faculty pursuing funding from the National Endowment for the Arts with a faculty panel (May 2023).

#### PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

All OSP staff are committed to professional development. During the cycle, staff attended the following professional conferences and facilitated professional training for others in the profession. To keep abreast of rapidly changing sponsor requirements and the ever-changing regulatory environment, staff must devote significant effort on training. The OSP Team receives professional training from a variety of outlets and resources including JMU's Talent Development, professional organizations like NCURA, SRAi, and targeted sponsor training opportunities from agencies like the National Science Foundation and the National Institutes of Health.

Training for new team members is on-the-job shadowing in addition to intensive deep dives offered through our professional societies, of which we are all individual or institutional members:

- NCURA National Council of University Research Administrators
- SRAI Society of Research Administrators International

The OSP Team receives professional training from a variety of outlets and resources including JMU's Talent Development, professional organizations like NCURA, SRAi, and targeted sponsor training opportunities from agencies like the National Science Foundation and the National Institutes of Health.

**Certified Research Administration (CRA) Certification**: one team member attended study sessions for the CRA and attained her certification in December 2022.

**VA-Society of Research Administrators Meeting,** June 3, 2022 at Virginia Tech. The Director and Associate Director attended. The Director and Associate Director will also attend in July 2023 at George Mason University.

**DEI Training Content** – during this cycle all team members undertook to DEI training of at least 10 hours, surpassing the unit's goal at 88 hours.

#### Web-Based Trainings:

All OSP Staff are committed to continuous training on sponsor-based portals and systems and to building their general Research Administration knowledge base. A number of free webinars were offered through NCURA and SRAi including sessions on how to continue operations while working remotely and the move to teleworking within the profession. Free NIH and NSF webinars (including focus on CAREER applications) were also watched by OSP staff.

Newer team members all take a series of online intensive training courses offered through either NCURA or SRAi to orient them to the themes of research administration. More senior team members avail themselves of the opportunity to study towards attainment of the Certified Research Administration (CRA) certification.

All team members are afforded the opportunity to attend at least one in-person training per year at a conference of their preference.
