Writing for Action

Grammar

- Use active voice: subject performs the action
- Avoid passive voice: action is performed upon the subject
- Avoid ambiguous wording
- Replace noun phrases with verbs (make a decision/decide)

Discuss:

• Which grammar rules trip you up?

Structure

- Use plain (not formal) language
- Begin with the important information
- Pretend every word costs money
- Avoid acronyms
- To fix out-of-focus ideas, correct sentence structure or punctuation

Discuss:

• What formal terms do you replace/simplify?

Layout

- Use line breaks or short paragraphs
- Consider bulleted or numbered lists
- Put data in a chart for visual learners
- Add an image for clarity
- Add white space for easy reading

Discuss:

• Do you prefer bullets, numbers, or no lists?
