

Who Should Take the Course?

This four-day workshop is designed for Speech and Language Pathologists. This activity may be used to meet the American Speech and Hearing Association (ASHA) certification maintenance requirement if you determine that (1) content is relevant to your area of practice and your practice setting and (2) you are in your 3-year maintenance interval.
