FACTS ON

SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS

-  1 in 5 women and 1 in 16 men are sexually assaulted while in college.
-  1 in 4 girls and 1 in 6 boys will be sexually abused before they turn 18 years old.
-  Rape is the most under-reported crime; 63% of sexual assaults are not reported to police. Only 12% of child sexual abuse is reported to the authorities.
-  More than 90% of sexual assault victims on college campuses do not report the assault.
-  The prevalence of false reporting is between 2% and 10%. This is consistent with the false reporting rates for other violent crimes.
-  In 8 out of 10 cases of rape, the victim knew the person who sexually assaulted them.
-  63.3% of men at one university who self-reported acts qualifying as rape or attempted rape admitted to committing repeat rapes.

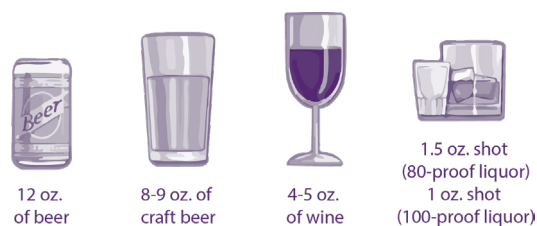
ALCOHOL AWARENESS MONTH
