- Congratulations to Dr. [Puzant Balozian](#), assistant professor of Computer Information Systems and co-author of "[Cyberbullying: A multidisciplinary review and agenda for future research in the era of artificial intelligence](#)," just published by the [International Journal of Information Management](#). After analyzing 83 articles, Puzant and co-authors synthesized key themes, including the attributes of workplace cyberbullying (WCB), its technological enablers, emotional drivers, environmental factors and organizational control mechanisms. By highlighting gaps in detecting and preventing WCB, the paper underscores the importance of interdisciplinary approaches in addressing WCB and offers actionable insights for future research and organizational practices to enhance employee well-being and workplace culture.
- Representing Graduate Psychology, Dr. [Trevor Stokes](#) received the [E. Scott Geller Award for Distinguished Service in Applied Behavioral Science](#) from the [Virginia Association for Behavior Analysis](#) at their annual conference. JMU undergraduate alum and current Psy.D. student [Valencia Pankey](#) won the [VABA Early Career Award](#). Nice to see two of the three awards given by VABA go to JMU!
- [Media Messages in the 2022 Midterm Election: Division, Deniers, Dobbs, and the Donald](#) – by Dr. Dan Schill, Professor in the School of Communication Studies – has been released by Routledge. Co-edited with John Allen Hendricks from Stephen F. Austin University, the volume includes contributions from scholars at Georgetown, East Carolina University, University of Louisville, Texas State, UNF, CSUSB and more. The book was endorsed by Harvard's [Thomas Patterson](#) as "A must-read for anyone... seeking to understand the media's evolving election role."
