Happy fall semester! It's exciting to see our campus full of activity again, and I'm delighted to update you on some of your colleagues' recent achievements.

- Congratulations to JMU Libraries, whose <u>Carrier Renovation and Expansion website</u> was selected as the <u>winner of a public relations award</u> from the American Library Association! The award "recognizes the very best public relations materials produced by libraries in the past year." <u>Kristen Shuyler</u>, faculty member in Libraries, wrote the award application and led the Libraries team that created the website.
- Research done by faculty and alumni in the <u>Center for Assessment and Research Studies</u> (CARS) resulte d in <u>the addition of two new standards</u> in the professional standards set by <u>Council for the Advancement of Standards in Higher Education</u> (CAS). Dr. <u>Sara Finney</u> (Associate Director of the Center for Assessme nt and Research Studies; Professor in Graduate Psychology) provided invited feedback to the CAS governing board, drawing from collaborations with colleagues and graduate student co-investigators, and closed the loop between research and professional praxis.
