Hello Colleagues,

I continue to hear from faculty, staff and students about the outstanding scholarship and teaching that happens across campus. While this is just a small sample of the many activities going on, I wanted to pass along some updates that were recently shared with me.

- The College of Education has 16 faculty representing JMU at the <u>American Educational</u> <u>Research Association Annual Conference</u> (AERA). The conference is considered the most prestigious conference in the field of education for Research 1 and Research 2 institutions.
- The JMU STEM Center and Department of Biology faculty member George Vidal hosted the state-wide <u>Brain Bee</u> event earlier this month with nearly 50 13 to 19-year-old students. The Bee provides hands-on neuroscience related demos, lab visits and interaction with JMU faculty and students, as well as a neuroscience competition for high schoolers, the winner of which will go on to compete at the national Bee at UC Irvine in April.
- Associate Professor of History <u>Rebecca Brannon</u> recently received a fellowship grant from the <u>National Endowment for the Humanities</u> (NEH) for her project "Old Age in the Wake of the American Revolution." These grants are designed to support advanced research and writing projects by humanities scholars.
- <u>Gina MacDonald</u>, Professor in the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry, was named a 2022 <u>American Association for the Advancement of Science Fellow</u>, one of the scientific community's most distinguished honors. This year, only 505 new fellows were selected worldwide.
- <u>Diana Galarreta-Aima</u>, Associate Professor of Spanish, partnered with JMU Libraries and received a \$30K VIVA Open Course Grant to create <u>a no-cost</u>, <u>open textbook for</u> <u>intermediate medical Spanish</u>. "Language and culture are so important in providing better healthcare for these communities," said Dr. Galarreta-Aima. "And we were like, 'Okay, let's make it free!""

It was great to see faculty and staff from the College of Science and Mathematics when I dropped by EnGEO last week. I heard about their four – four! – REU (Research Experiences for Undergraduates) programs. Our students are so lucky to work with such involved faculty.

I hope that you will attend – and encourage your students to attend – the upcoming talk "Engaging with the Past to Embrace the Future: Indigenous Communities," presented by the Senior Advisor to the President for Native American Affairs at the University of Minnesota, Karen Diver.
