Purple Friday Initiative

During the University Welcome Back Presidential Address, President Alger announced that Friday, September 2 would kick off the "Purple Friday Initiative" and encouraged everyone to wear purple on Friday's throughout the year.

The purple and gold colors of James Madison University date back to the institution's first year in operation 1909-1910. Two literary societies were formed that year, the Lee Literary Society and the Lanier Literary Society. The Lee Society was named for Confederate General Robert E. Lee and the Lanier Society for Southern poet, Sidney Lanier. Each of the literary societies chose its own colors; violet and white for the Lanier Society and gray and gold for the Lee Society. The violet from the Lanier Society was combined with the gold of the Lee Society to create the school colors for the State Normal and Industrial School for Women in Harrisonburg.

In a few years, these colors evolved into purple and gold, since purple was an easier color to obtain for pennants and other decorations.

Several literary societies flourished during the early years of the institution and played a major role in the school's extracurricular activities.
