I've been working closely with the deans to anticipate our next steps. While we've tried to think of everything, we know additional issues will come up. We're committed to doing our best for you and our students, so we welcome your advice and perspective. This is a time to share our combined experience and focus on leveraging the technological and pedagogical resources our faculty are known for.
