Charge

The Rwanda subcommittee supports and coordinates efforts to expand JMU partnerships with governmental and higher education institutions in Rwanda by focusing on identifying, growing, and maintaining university partnerships. These efforts include faculty development and exchanges, student study-abroad experiences and internships, and institution-to-institution collaborations.

Fall Activity

Graduate Student Recruitment & Retention: New graduate students from Rwanda matriculated to JMU in the areas of Public Administration (2) and Sport and Recreation Management (1). Cochairs of the subcommittee and Oris Griffin, from the College of Education, helped facilitate the matriculation and student hiring processes for the students in partnership with the Center for Global Engagement.

Ministry of Education MOU Development: Co-chairs worked with the new Minister of Education, through iDebate Rwanda, to develop a draft MOU for participation in the Teacher Leadership program. In partnership with the President's Office, an invitation by JMU to the Minister of Education was provided for the Minister to meet with stakeholders from the Harrisonburg area and with university administrators that included REDI leadership, CARS leadership, COE leadership, Academic Affairs leadership, President's Office, and Rockingham County Public Schools' leaders. The planned visit was for the week of November 29; however, due to last-minute request of the Minister, the visit was postponed until spring 2023.

Establish Priorities: During the first fall meeting of the subcommittee, held on September 21, 2023 in Memorial Hall, Jean Michel Habineza, CEO of iDebate Rwanda attended via Zoom and briefed the subcommittee on the priorities of the Rwanda government. The three priorities shared were established to facilitate the work of the subcommittee including: 1) tourism and sports management, 2) education, and 3) health care. Each of the subcommittee members represents these areas of focus.

During October, subcommittee members shared these priorities with colleagues within their respective departments, colleges, and units to prepare for updates at the November subcommittee meeting, held on November 10 in Memorial Hall. During the November 10 meeting, Jean Michel Habineza attended in person, as he was visiting colleagues in the DC area. The

subcommittee recommended that iDebate Rwanda serve as the implementation partner for the work of the subcommittee to leverage the strengths, connections, and relationships with governmental officials. iDebate Rwanda has the physical space and infrastructure to host JMU visitors and to facilitate meetings with appropriate governmental and organizational leaders.
