

James Madison University R.N. to B.S.N. Co-Enrollment Program Memorandum of Agreement

James Madison University and Southside Virginia Community College

James Madison University (JMU) and Southside Virginia Community College (SVCC), recognizing the need for registered nurses to achieve baccalaureate degrees in nursing through an education system that promotes seamless academic progression, hereby resolve to adopt a James Madison University R.N. to B.S.N. Co-Enrollment Program Memorandum of Agreement.

The R.N. to B.S.N. Co-Enrollment Program is designed for nursing students who wish to obtain an Associate of Applied Science Degree (A.A.S.) in Nursing at SVCC and complete a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (B.S.N) Degree via the R.N. to B.S.N. Program at JMU. Students who 1) have been accepted into the Southside Virginia Community College nursing program, 2) present transcripts reflecting a cumulative GPA on all college work attempted of 2.5 or better on a 4-point scale, 3) have completed all prerequisite courses with a grade of "C" or better, 4) are able to meet JMU School of Nursing Technical Standards for nursing practice (posted on the JMU School of Nursing website), and 5) complete a transcript review with the R.N. to B.S.N. program that reflects all prerequisite courses have been or will be completed by the time a student will enter the first co-enrollment semester are eligible for the R.N. to B.S.N. Co-Enrollment Program and will follow the R.N. to B.S.N. Co-Enrollment Curriculum Outline and Advising Guide.

The Co-Enrollment Program Memorandum of Agreement provides SVCC nursing students with the opportunity to dually enroll at JMU as Non-Degree Seeking Students while completing the Associate of Applied Science Degree (A.A.S.) in Nursing at SVCC. For a two-year period, SVCC nursing students enroll in specified JMU R.N. to B.S.N. Co-Enrollment Program courses and SVCC Clinical Component nursing courses concurrently; a total of 26 nursing credits earned during the co-enrollment period (thirteen credits earned at SVCC and thirteen credits earned at JMU) will be applied toward the B.S.N Degree. After students earn the Associate of Applied Science Degree (A.A.S.) in Nursing at SVCC and obtain a current unrestricted R.N. license in any state, Washington D.C., or a U.S possession or territory, they will be admitted to the JMU R.N. to B.S.N. Co-Enrollment Program as a degree-seeking student and will have the application fee waived. Students must complete their Associate Degree in nursing from SVCC within three years; failure to complete an associate degree in nursing from SVCC will result in automatic removal from the JMU R.N. to B.S.N. Co-Enrollment Program.

R.N. to B.S.N. Co-Enrollment Program students must, prior to graduation with a B.S.N. degree, provide proof of employment as an R.N. for a minimum of 540 hours. Students will receive 37 experiential portfolio credits upon presenting the Proof of Employment documentation. Additional requirements to graduate with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing include:

- Thirteen additional general education credits that may be taken concurrently at SVCC and/or JMU with nursing course work but must be completed prior to graduation. These required General Education courses are:
 - o Cluster 2: Human Questions and Contexts (3 credit hours)

- o Cluster 2: Visual and Performing Arts (3 credit hours)
- o Cluster 2: Literature (3 credit hours)
- o Cluster 4: The American Experience (4 credit hours)
- Three additional JMU RN to BSN Program requirement credit hours that may be taken concurrently at SVCC and/or JMU with nursing course work but must be completed prior to graduation.
- o Completion of all nursing courses with a grade of "C" or better
- Official transcripts for all transfer and affiliated courses are on file in the JMU Office of the Registrar
- Earn a minimum of 123 credit hours to graduate (includes transfer credit from SVCC). Of the 123 credit hours, students must earn a minimum of 60 credit hours at a four-year institution and a minimum 30 credit hours at JMU.

Accompanying this Memorandum of Agreement is a <u>Curriculum Outline and Advising Guide</u>, which specifies the courses that the student will take at SVCC and JMU.

TERMS OF MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

- 1. SVCC will designate officials who will be responsible for all aspects of the Memorandum of Agreement at SVCC. JMU will designate individuals responsible for all aspects of this Memorandum of Agreement at JMU.
 - Representing JMU will be the Vice Provost for Academic Development.
 - Representing SVCC will be the Vice President of Instruction and Student Services.
- 2. Both parties are to communicate the conditions of this Memorandum of Agreement to their respective clientele (external and internal constituents). JMU and SVCC will review this Memorandum of Agreement every three years and make adjustments or amendments as deemed appropriate to maintain the integrity of each institution as well as for the improvement of the transfer process. Such changes will not adversely affect students already enrolled and covered under the provisions of the existing Memorandum of Agreement.
- 3. The Memorandum of Agreement will remain in effect until terminated by either party upon written notice to the other party of an intention to terminate. Such notice should be given at least one year in advance of the effective date of termination, and students who entered under the Memorandum of Agreement may take advantage of its terms for four years after termination becomes effective.

End of Dual SVCC/JMU Enrollment: Students will be automatically admitted into the traditional RN to BSN Program providing that the SVCC Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing has been earned and a current unrestricted RN license has been obtained.

EBIO 141, BIO 142, AND BIO 150 – A grade of "C" or higher is required. These courses must be repeated if they were taken more than eight years prior to application for admission to the PVCC Both BIO 141 and BIO 142 must be completed to receive BIO 270 and 290 credit; additionally, both courses must be completed AT THE SAME INSTITUTION.
