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ADMITTED STUDENTS NEXT STEPS

Decision made, deposit paid

Is your student ready to commit to JMU? While all admitted students have until the deposit deadline of May 1st, students are encouraged to pay their deposit now.

If your students have financial need or are unable to pay the \$400 amount, have them reach out to their <u>regional counselor</u>. We will work with students to secure a partial or full deposit waiver.

<u>The One Book</u>

The <u>One Book</u> is a one-stop-shop that contains all of the important steps, details, and information students need to begin the transition to JMU. The One Book and its companion website will guide students through a series of tasks to complete in preparation for Summer Orientation and their arrival to campus in August.

Summer Bridge Program for First-Generation College Students


Take part in a five-day residential program, designed **exclusively for first-generation business students** through which you'll gain confidence, build a strong support network and prepare for success in your first year at JMU.
