Applying to Honors

A separate application is required for admission into the Honors College. There is no Honors College application fee.

After completing and submitting the JMU undergraduate admissions application, students will receive an email with a link to apply to the Honors College.

Honors College First-Year Application Deadlines:

- Early Action applicants: November 8
- Regular Decision applicants: January 22

Honors College Transfer Application Deadlines:

- Spring applicants: November 15
- Fall applicants: May 15

Application Evaluation

All Honors applicants with complete files are given the same consideration by a committee of Honors College professors and administrators.

Admission to the Honors College is based on:

- Strength of application essays
- High school/College academic performance
- Leadership, service and work experience
- Extracurricular activities may be taken into consideration

Essays are evaluated for an understanding of the Honors College's purpose. Applicants are especially encouraged to submit essays that show creative endeavors, personal reflection and collaboration. Essays should show a passion for interdisciplinary learning.
