WAYS TO VISIT CAMPUS

COMMON APPLICATION & JMU

Honors and Distinctions

This is an area where students can list any of the things that they may have received recognitions for: Eagle Scout, 1st Team All-State, 1st place Oyster Queen Pageant, Perfect Attendance, National Honors Society, etc. This section will not be downloaded into our system (PeopleSoft) due to a problem with matching data fields. We are asking it separately in the JMU section of the Common App and will download that as we have normally.

Activities

The Common App gives students a chance to list up to 10 activities in this section. To keep things fair with our other two applications, we are only downloading the first 6 responses. We encourage students to list the most important ones to them first rather than thinking of this in a chronological or alphabetical way.

Additional Information

There is a section on the Common App where students can write anything (up to 250 words) about themselves that is not included elsewhere but that the admissions committee should know (think "letter of circumstance"). We are planning on downloading this section and it will be included in our review.

COVID Section

Instead of having boxes to check like in our own application and the Coalition Application, the Common App has an open area where students can write about how COVID-19 has impacted them. Similar to the Additional Information, we will be downloading this section and it will be included in our review.

Common App Essay

The Common App has its own prompt for an essay. JMU will not be downloading this information, but if students want to use that, they can cut and paste it into our Personal Statement section (*there may be differences in word length).

Letter of Recommendation

Our process for receiving letters of recommendation through the Common App will function very similarly to the process laid out in the Coalition App. We are still only accepting **one** letter of recommendation per student. If a student sends his/her letter of recommendation through the Common App via Naviance, we will receive it. If a student sends his/her letter of recommendation through Naviance via Parchment, the letter will not be uploaded in our system.

APPLICATION FEE WAIVERS

Each of our three applications has questions built into them to determine fee waiver eligibility. Students should answer the series of questions honestly and accurately. Based on those responses, the application fee will be waived for those who qualify. If a student does not qualify based on one of the application questions but cannot afford the application fee, the next step depends on which application the student is completing:

- On the ApplyWeb application, students can provide an explanation for their fee waiver request. After review, those who qualify will have their fee manually waived.
- On the Coalition Application, students can reach out to their regional admissions counselor, who can provide them with a one-time waiver code.
- On the Common Application, students can check a box saying they will submit a statement explaining their request. This statement should be submitted to their regional admissions counselor as soon as possible, but it should not delay submitting their application.

Please refer any additional questions on this front to your school's <u>regional admissions</u> counselor.

APPLYING TO THE HONORS COLLEGE

There has been a change in the application process for the JMU Honors College. Students will now have two deadlines to choose from: applying through the Early Action process (deadline of November 8th) or applying through the Regular Decision process (deadline of February 2nd). Decisions will be released in MyMadison two weeks after the Office of Admissions releases decisions.

The application process remains straightforward. Students must complete the separate Honors College application, including responding to one of the four essay prompts (with no more than 250 words). Academic performance and the essay response will be the two main factors reviewed in the evaluation process.
