ADMISSIONS INSIGHT

Recognizing Competitive Applicants:

Our primary considerations in our evaluation process both relate to academic performance.

- Taking a rigorous course curriculum (defined within the context of each high school) such as:
 - College-level courses (Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, Dual Enrollment, Cambridge International, Governor's Schools)
 - Honors, advanced, or college preparatory courses
- Earning As and Bs in core academic classes (English, foreign language*, social studies, mathematics** and lab sciences).
 - *Foreign language requirement: either two years of 2 languages or three years of 1 language.
 - **Mathematics requirement: One full year beyond Algebra II in a course for which Algebra II is the prerequisite.

At a school that offers college-level and honors-level courses, competitive applicants will take advantage of these opportunities. We expect to see a nice sampling of both college-level and honors-level classes on an applicant's transcript, as that demonstrates to us that the applicant is prepared for the academic rigor of JMU.

At a school that does not offer college or honors-level curriculum, competitive applicants will challenge themselves with advanced core subjects or additional core classes than required for graduation. For example, students can take a fourth year of a foreign language or physics as their lab science.

Students who take both a rigorous course curriculum and earn strong grades will be competitive for admission.

Optional Application Components:

Students are not advantaged or disadvantaged by electing to send in optional components in the application, scholarship, or Honors College review processes.

The following items are optional:

- Extracurricular Activities
- Letter of Recommendation
- Common App Essay / Personal Statement
- Standardized Tests

*Submission of optional materials is most beneficial to an applicant when it provides context and insight into a student's academic performance.

NEW @ JMU

James Madison University Rankings

In only its second year of being ranked among national universities, James Madison University jumped eight spots to No. 64 among public institutions in U.S. News & World Report's 2024 Best Colleges rankings.

Overall, JMU moved up 27 spots to No. 124 nationally. U.S. News & World Report defines "national universities" as offering "a range of undergraduate majors, plus master's and doctoral programs, and [emphasizing] faculty research or [awarding] professional practice doctorates."

In 2022, JMU earned a Carnegie Commission classification of R2 Doctoral University with "high research activity." JMU's U.S. News ranking profile places it in the top tier of academic institutions in the country.

This year's rankings reflect a change in methodology, including an increased emphasis on how often a school's students from all socioeconomic backgrounds earned degrees as well as graduation rates. Other measures included peer assessments, first-year retention rates, performance of first-generation students and Pell Grant recipients, graduates' earnings, faculty salaries and financial resources per student.

JMU's notable rankings in the 2024 Best Colleges report include:

- Top Public Schools No. 64
- Best Undergraduate Business No. 103
- Best Undergraduate Engineering Non-Doctorate No. 30
- Best Undergraduate Nursing No. 86
- Best Undergraduate Economics No. 145

James Madison Athletics initiated a new era impacting 200 student-athletes across eight sport programs with the completed renovation of the JMU_Convocation Center in August.

FRESHMAN SCHOLARSHIPS & FINANCIAL AID

Madison Scholarships Hub

Each year we award more than 400 one- to four-year scholarships to incoming students. The primary criterion for merit-based scholarships is exceptional academic performance. Some of our scholarships take a more holistic review and look at a student's leadership experience, service to the community, extra-curricular involvement, and career goals.

The <u>Madison Scholarships Hub</u>, which opened on October 5th, is the one-stop-shop for most scholarship opportunities at JMU. After a student applies to JMU, they will access the Hub in their MyMadison account. While we do automatically consider all students for some merit-based scholarships, there are additional opportunities that require supplemental information/an additional application to be considered. Please encourage your student to utilize and continuously check the Hub for scholarship information.

Financial Aid:

A student's college education is one of the most significant investments a student and their family will ever make. The Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships will help guide students and their families through the financial aid process by providing clear direction and helpful resources. To determine a student's eligibility for assistance, he/she will need to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). To receive a financial aid package, our federal school code (003721) must be listed on the form. The priority filing deadline is March 1st.

Financial aid preliminary award notices will be uploaded into admitted students' MyMadison accounts approximately two weeks after admissions decisions are released.

Students can use our <u>Net Price Calculator</u> to help plan for future educational costs.
