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### ADMITTED STUDENT PROGRAMMING

### ADMITTED STUDENT NEXT STEPS

### Decision made, deposit paid

Is your student ready to commit to JMU? While all admitted students have until the deposit deadline of May 1st, students are encouraged to pay their deposit now. Selection slots for choosing first-year residence halls is determined by when students pay their JMU admission deposit.

If your students have financial need or are unable to pay the \$400 amount, have them reach out to their <u>regional counselor</u>. We will work with students to secure a partial or full deposit waiver.

### <u>Defer Admission - Gap Year Policy</u>

If you have students that have expressed a desire to defer their admission, please refer them to our <u>Gap Year Policy</u> website for details and submission instructions.

The deadline to submit a gap year request is June 15.

### Decide not to attend JMU?

Please encourage students who have made the decision not to accept our offer of admission to fill out the <u>application withdrawal form</u>. This will notify us of their intent to enroll elsewhere and stop all communication from our office and our campus partners.

### **ORIENTATION 101**

For your students that have paid their deposit to JMU, we are excited to officially welcome them into the JMU Community! The next step is for matriculated students to work through our three-phrase orientation process.

### The One Book

The <u>One Book</u> is a one-stop-shop that contains all of the important steps, details, and information students need to begin the transition to JMU. The One Book and its companion website will guide students through a series of tasks to complete in preparation for Summer Springboard and their arrival to campus in August.

Some of the steps on the to-do list include:

- Creating a JMU student email account
- Emergency notification and contact information
- Preparing for class enrollment
  - confirming or changing major
- Math Assessment & Foreign Language Placement Exam
- First Year Housing
  - finding roommate and suitemates
  - signing housing contract
  - room selection
- JMU Access Card (student ID card)
- Immunization Forms
- And more!

### **Summer Springboard**

This is a one day summer orientation program that provides each student with the opportunity to meet with their academic advisor, connect with other students, and engage with their Orientation Peer Advisor (OPA). This is a required step and there will be both in-person and virtual options for students and families to attend.

### 1787 Weeks of Welcome

This is the official beginning of each student's JMU experience...students will move into their residence hall, reconnect with their OPA, meet their First yeaR Orientation Guides (FROGs), and be immersed in several academic and social programs throughout the first few weeks to help them become acclimated to campus.

### EARNING COLLEGE CREDIT

### Advanced Placement (AP)/International Baccalaureate (IB):

• Students seeking to earn college credit for AP or IB classes must earn a qualifying score on the applicable examination and submit that to JMU directly from the testing agency.

### <u>Dual Enrollment (DE):</u>

• Students seeking to earn college credit for DE classes must send an official college transcript directly from the awarding institution to the JMU Office of the Registrar. The Registrar will then complete a transfer credit evaluation which posts to the student's MyMadison portal for review.

\*Students will earn credit for all transferable courses in which they have earned a grade of "C" or better, but their grade point average for those courses does not transfer to their JMU record.

### BRIDGE TO MADISON PROGRAM

The BRidge to Madison (Bridge) program is an **invitation-only program** designed for a select group of prospective JMU students who begin their academic studies at Blue Ridge Community College (BRCC) while living and engaging as a JMU Duke at James Madison University. The collaboration between JMU and BRCC allows students to make academic progress in their first-year general education courses and, upon successful completion, transition to JMU courses at the start of the second academic year culminating in a JMU degree.

Invited students have been deemed by the JMU Admissions Office as showing academic promise as degree-seeking JMU students after successful completion of appropriate BRCC coursework. Bridge students have the opportunity to experience many of the activities and privileges of attending JMU while taking advantage of the excellent academic offering and often smaller class sizes at BRCC. Students must complete the Bridge Transition requirement of the program in order to transition to degree-seeking at JMU.

Our JMU and BRCC staff are excited about this new partnership and its opportunities for future Dukes!
