Who is Guaranteed On-Campus Housing?

First-year students are guaranteed on-campus housing in a residence hall. Students may secure on-campus housing beyond their first year by signing a Live On Again Contract. On-campus housing options are also available for incoming transfer students.

Residence Halls Amenities

- Vending areas
- Kitchens
- Computer Labs in some halls
- Wireless internet and Ethernet connections are available in each room, along with cable connections.
- Laundry facilities each residence hall is equipped with a laundry room containing washing machines and dryers. Laundry equipment is coin-operated or JACard accessible.
- Study lounges located in every hall and are separate from TV lounges and lobby lounges and should be treated as 24-hour quiet areas.

Are Roommates Assigned?

A first-year student may choose a roommate if they have a friend who is also attending JMU. Otherwise, the Office of Residence Life uses information from a housing survey, taken during the orientation process, to assign roommates based on preferences such as loud/quiet, late/early to bed, neat/messy, etc.

What Happens if I Want to Change Roommates?

Except for a three-week period at the beginning of the semester, students may request a room change any time. Students should consult with their residence hall staff for room change procedures.
