We have three virtual fellows with us this semester. These are experts in their fields from the Global South, helping the AAAD Studies Center's mission to advance decolonial knowledge about people of African descent. Here is a glimpse into their expertise and research.



Dr. Kwabena Opoku-Agyemang is a lecturer in English at the University of Ghana and the Academic Director of its School for International Training. His primary scholarly interests are the analyses of digital forms in African literature. He has also guest-edited special editions of *Journal of Gaming and Virtual Worlds and Postcolonial Text*.



Dr. Mshai Mwangola holds a PhD in Performance Studies from Northwestern University (USA). Her thesis on Kenya's Uhuru Generation, titled "Performing Our Stories, Performing OurSelves," approaches the idea of a generational historical mission through the recreation, invocation and facilitation of performance as a site of individual and communal reflection.



Dr. Jane Mutheu Mutune holds a Doctoral Degree (PhD) in Environmental Governance and Management from the University of Nairobi. Dr. Mutune is an expert in Environmental Governance and Management with a specialization in forest governance and rural livelihoods. She advocates that waste is not waste but a resource.
