

Art Education teaching licensure requirements checklist

In addition to the general education and academic major requirements, students desiring PreK-12 teaching licensure in art must complete 15 credits of additional course work in art education, 8 credits of education and psychology, and 16 credits of student teaching. It is necessary to be admitted to the teacher education program prior to enrolling in professional education courses. For a complete description of admission and retention policies and procedures for teacher education, refer to the College of Education. Students seeking licensure are encouraged to consult regularly with the program coordinator of art education. The undergraduate degree leading to licensure must include the following minimum requirements in art:

- Nine credits in art history and art appreciation,
- Twenty-seven studio credits, with a minimum of six credits in each of three separate studio areas.
 - Six credits in ceramics and crafts, with a minimum of one course in ceramics,
 - Six credits in three-dimensional media,
 - Twelve credits in two-dimensional media,
 - Three credits to complete a minimum of six credits in each of three separate studio areas.

Course Requirements

The following is a list of the required courses leading to PreK-12 art licensure and a suggested sequence of when each may be taken.

B.F.A. Art and art related electives may include courses from graphic design, interior design, art education, and internships, but excludes courses taken to fulfill the studio concentration.

- Declare major and Art Teaching Licensure
- Complete Application to Teacher Education
- No felony or misdemeanors
- Submit two references
- Maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher
- C or better in PSYC 160, WRTC 103 and EDUC 300 or equivalent courses
- VCLA Reading & Writing (composite score of 470), plus one of the following Math assessments:
 - Praxis Core Math (score of 150); or
 - SAT Math score of 560
 - ACT Math score of 22
- Complete *Child Abuse Prevention Awareness* training
- Certification in emergency first aid, CPR, and AED
- Dyslexia Awareness* training
- Complete Pre-Professional Self-Assessment and subscribe to TK-20

JMU Art Education licensure requirements*

- Maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher in all ARED courses
- Apply for Student Teaching
- Behavior Intervention* training
- Praxis II - Art: Content Knowledge (5134) score of 158 or higher (semester prior to Student Teaching)
- Successful completion of student teaching (apply one full year prior to student teaching)
