Art Education teaching licensure requirements checklist

In addition to the general education and academic major requirements, students desiring PreK-12 teaching licensure in art must complete 18 credits of additional course work in art education, 8 credits of education and psychology, and 16 credits of student teaching. It is necessary to be admitted to the teacher education program prior to enrolling in professional education courses. For a complete description of admission and retention policies and procedures for teacher education, refer to the College of Education. Students seeking licensure are encouraged to consult regularly with the program coordinator of art education. The undergraduate degree leading to licensure must include the following minimum requirements in art:

- Nine credits in art history and art appreciation,
- Twenty-seven studio credits, with a minimum of six credits in each of three separate studio areas.
 - Six credits in ceramics and crafts, with a minimum of one course in ceramics,
 - Six credits in three-dimensional media,
 - Twelve credits in two-dimensional media, in four different media,
 - Three credits to complete a minimum of six credits in each of three separate studio areas.

Course Requirements

The following is a list of the required courses leading to PreK-12 art licensure and a suggested sequence of when each may be taken.
