DUKE HALL, STUDIO DESIGN CENTER, MHAC

Duke Hall houses Art History, Art Education and six Studio Art programs. Renovated in 2014, the 115,000-square-foot facility features open and well-lit studios, dedicated critique spaces, high-tech seminar rooms, classrooms, lecture halls and state-of-the-art equipment. Support areas include a space for woodworking and a Visual Resources Center (VRC).

The Duke Hall Gallery of Fine Art is a 3,000-square-foot professional gallery featuring exhibitions of regional, national and international significance.

Renovated in the spring of 2015, the Studio Design Center allows for collaboration between the Architectural, Graphic and Industrial Design programs.

The 30,700-square-foot space contains:

- Spacious studios with new workstations
- New bookmaking and letterpress equipment
- Concrete lab, woodshop and casting space
- Computer labs, laser cutters and 3D printers
- 3,000 square feet of shared pin-up space

Memorial Hall Arts Center (MHAC) houses Photography, featuring a traditional darkroom, digital and alternative process labs and a Light & Sound studio.





WAYLAND HALL ARTS LEARNING COMMUNITY

Sponsored by JMU's College of Visual and Performing Arts, Wayland Hall is home to a thriving arts living-learning community that embodies an ethic of interdisciplinary collaboration. Designed as a flexible space for performance and practice, the residence features many dynamic areas, including a main performance space that accommodates up to 90 people. As a member of the Arts Learning Community, students participate in a one-credit seminar class that emphasizes artists as citizen leaders.

ART EDUCATION
