<p>Presidential Proclamation: Restricting the Entry of Foreign Nationals To Protect the United States From Foreign Terrorists and Other National Security and Public Safety Threats, 90 Federal Register 24497, June 10, 2025</p>	<p>PROCLAMATION: ...It is the policy of the United States to protect its citizens from aliens who intend to commit terrorist attacks, threaten our national security, espouse hateful ideology, or otherwise exploit the immigration laws for malevolent purposes....The Secretary of State determined that a number of countries remain deficient with regards to screening and vetting...Nationals (both immigrants and non-immigrants) from the following countries will have fully restricted or limited entry to the US: Afghanistan, Burma, Chad, Republic of the Congo, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Haiti, Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, and Yemen. Partial restrictions to entry will be placed on nationals from Burundi, Cuba, Laos, Sierra Leone, Togo, Turkmenistan, and Venezuela.</p> <p>EFFECTIVE DATE: June 9, 2025</p>
<p>Executive Order 14305: Restoring American Airspace Sovereignty, 90 Federal Register 24719, June 16, 2025</p>	<p>EXECUTIVE ORDER: It is the policy of the United States to ensure control over our national airspace and to protect the public, critical infrastructure, mass gathering events, and military and sensitive government installations and operations from threats posed by the careless or unlawful use of UAS. This EO outlines several directives (NPRM restricting drone access over critical infrastructure and other facilities), enforcing civil and criminal laws when drone operators endanger the public or violate airspace restrictions, providing automated real-time access to PIA associated with UAS remote identification signals, implementing recommendations with regard to the creation of the National Training Center for Counter-Unmanned Aircraft Systems Center).</p>
<p>EXECUTIVE ORDER 14307: Unleashing American Drone Dominance, 90 Federal Register 24727, June 16, 2025</p>	<p>EXECUTIVE ORDER: It is the policy of the United States to ensure continued American leadership in the development, commercialization, and export of UAS by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">(a) accelerating the safe integration of UAS into the National Airspace System through timely, risk-based rulemaking that enables routine advanced operations;(b) advancing the domestic commercialization of UAS technologies at scale, including their safe and secure manufacturing, production, and integration, by supporting industry-led innovation, reducing regulatory uncertainty, and streamlining approvals and certification processes, including for consumer goods delivery and environmental reviews; and(c) strengthening the domestic drone industrial base and promoting the export of trusted, American-manufactured UAS through updated economic policies and regulation, coordinated trade, financing, and foreign engagement tools. <p>See FR link for details on directives for implementing this EO.</p>

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<p>Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act; Marketplace Integrity and Affordability, 90 Federal Register 27074, June 25, 2025</p>	<p>FINAL RULE: This final rule revises standards relating to denial of coverage for failure to pay past-due premium; excludes Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals recipients from the definition of “lawfully present;” establishes the evidentiary standard HHS uses to assess an agent's, broker's, or web-broker's potential noncompliance; revises the Exchange automatic reenrollment hierarchy; revises standards related to the annual open enrollment period and special enrollment periods; revises standards relating to failure to file and reconcile, income eligibility verifications for premium tax credits and cost-sharing reductions, annual eligibility redeterminations, de minimis thresholds for the actuarial value for plans subject to essential health benefits (EHB) requirements, and income-based cost-sharing reduction plan variations. This final rule also revises the premium adjustment percentage methodology and prohibits issuers of coverage subject to EHB requirements from providing coverage for specified sex-trait modification procedures as an EHB.</p> <p>EFFECTIVE DATE: August 25, 2025</p>
<p>Notice of Department of Veterans Affairs Implementation of Law Concerning Changes to Policies and Guidance Affecting the Educational Assistance Programs of the Department, 90 Federal Register 27906, June 30, 2025</p>	<p>NOTICE: The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is informing the public of efforts to implement Section 213 of the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvements Act (Dole Act), which requires VA to make notice and justification for changes in policy and guidance available to students, educational institutions, and the Committees on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and House of Representatives.</p>

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<p>Board of Accountancy Licensing, Virginia Register of Regulations, Volume 41, Issue 22, June 16, 2025</p>	<p>NOTICE OF INTENDED REGULATORY ACTION: Notice is hereby given in accordance with § 2.2-4007.01 of the Code of Virginia that the Board of Accountancy intends to consider amending 18VAC5-22, Board of Accountancy Regulations. The purpose of the proposed action is to revise the regulation to respond to Chapters 523 and 539 of the 2025 Acts of Assembly, which (i) eliminate the 150-hour education requirement for certified public accountant licensure, (ii) outline three additional licensure pathways, and (iii) redefine requirements regarding substantial equivalency and practice privilege. The proposed amendments in this document aim to revise corresponding VBOA regulations to ensure compliance with the new statutes.</p>
<p>Combatting Antisemitism & Anti-religious Bigotry in Virginia Public Schools and Institutions of Higher Education, Virginia Register of Regulations, Volume 41, Issue 22, June 16, 2025</p>	<p>EXECUTIVE ORDER # 48: I hereby issue this Executive Order to reaffirm the Commonwealth's commitment to safe educational environments free from discrimination and continue to act against antisemitism and anti-religious bigotry in Virginia's public schools and institutions of higher education. The Executive</p>

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	<p>Order directs the Virginia Dept of Ed to 1) Publish actionable resources that support the inclusion of the following within local school division Student Codes of Conduct, 2) Encourage treatment of harassment and discrimination that is motivated by or includes antisemitic intent, or bigotry against any religion, by any individual or as a result of school policies or programs on the school campus in the same manner as any other form of discrimination prohibited by state or federal law, 3) Encourage local school divisions to review with teachers and principals their policies and procedures for approving additional ancillary teaching resources to ensure that teachers are using high-quality and accurate instructional materials to teach about Judaism, Jewish history, the Holocaust, and Israel.4) Continue to make available high-quality instructional materials within the History and Social Science instructional guides and on the Department's GoOpenVA Hub that are accurate and complete in their coverage of Judaism, Jewish heritage and history, and Israel.. The Executive Order also directs SCHEV to Publish a model resolution for institutions of higher education and the order outlines specifics of what this should include and how it is to be implemented.</p>
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
