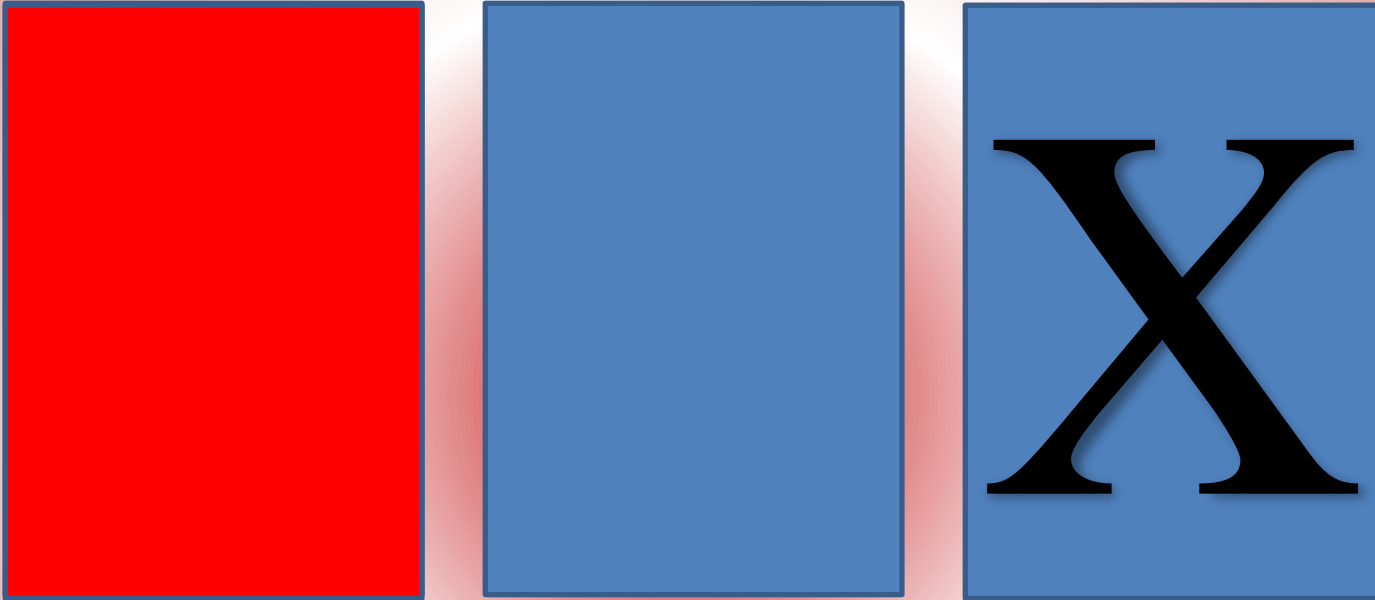

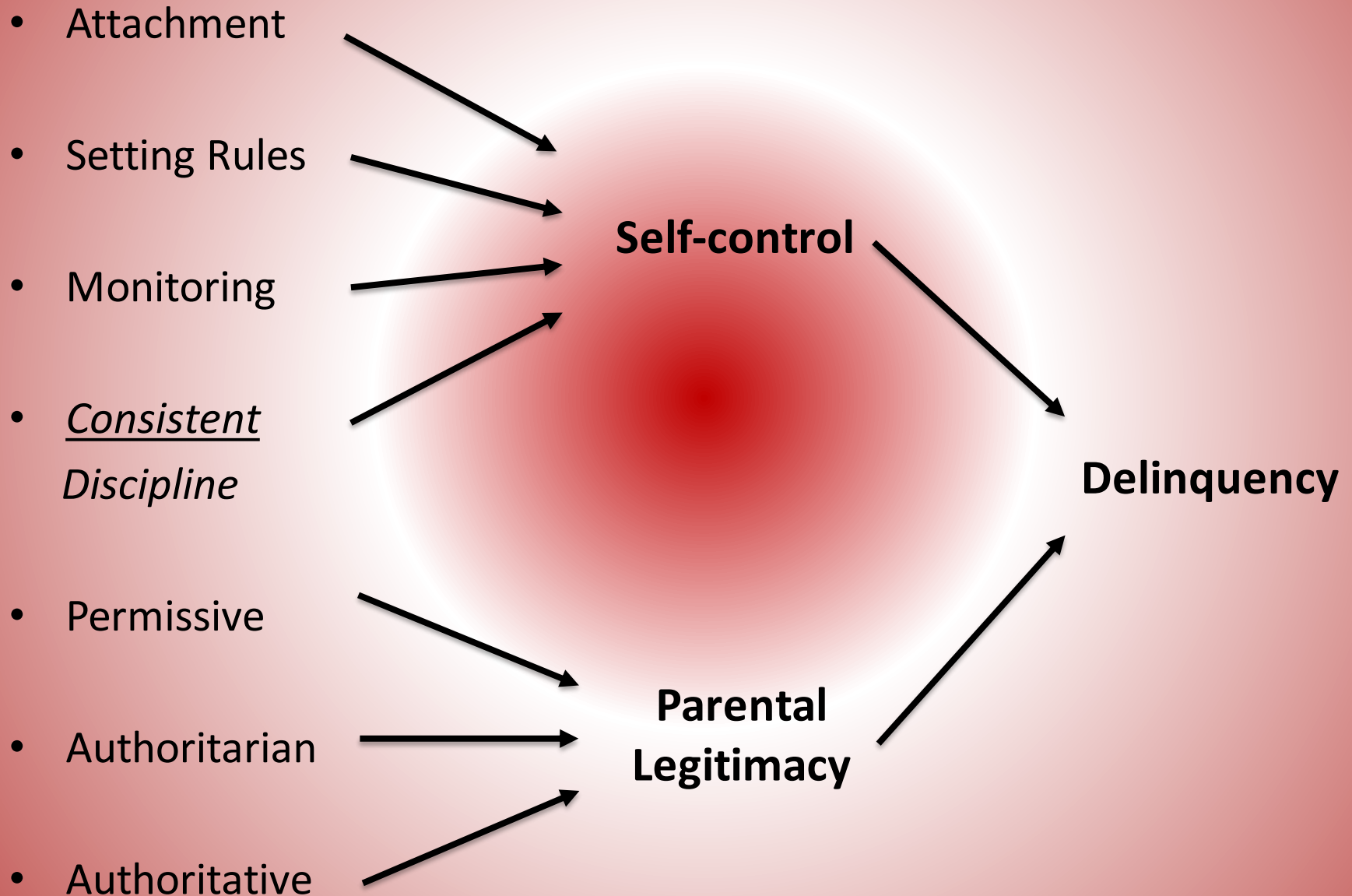
The Monty Hall Problem

- “Let’s make a deal...”

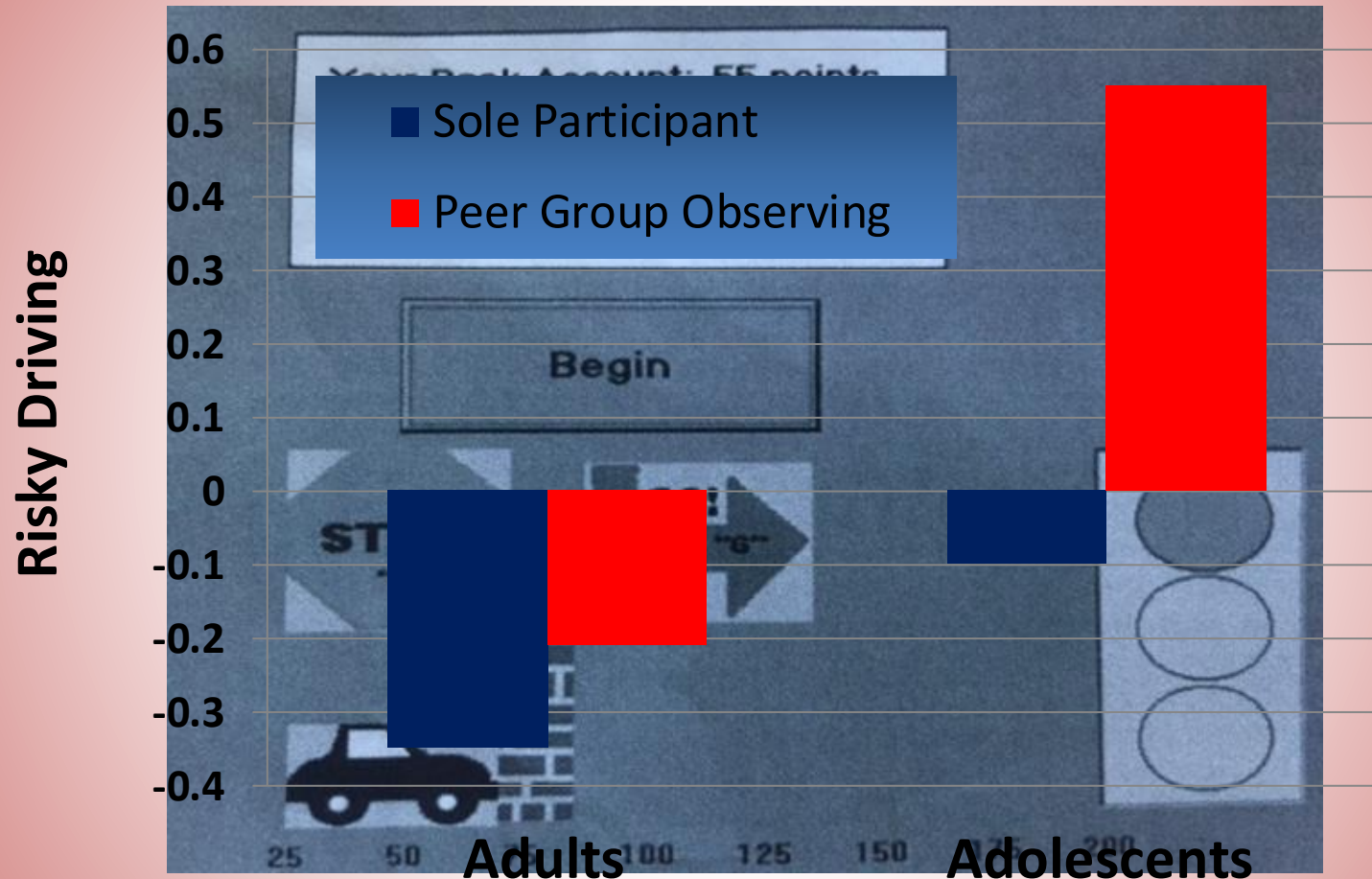


- Should you change your choice if given the opportunity to do so, or does it make no difference?
