Part 3: Executive Summary

Guided by National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) standards, the University Career Center (UCC) compiles data on the post-graduation pursuits of JMU graduates. For the Class of 2020, the UCC collected results from 82% of undergraduates and 55% of graduate students.

For bachelor's degree recipients in the class of 2020, 88.7% of undergraduates achieved a career outcome. Of these, 60.8% went to work, 27.0% continued their education. For those without an outcome, 11.0% were still seeking employment or education, and the remainder were not engaged or not seeking. The most popular areas for undergraduates working included Virginia, Washington D.C., Maryland, and New York. For those undergraduates working in Virginia, 44% were working in Northern Virginia, 24.2% in Central Virginia, and 20.2% were working in the Shenandoah Valley. Education, the health professions, and business were the most popular continuing education programs pursued.

For advanced degree recipients in the class of 2020, 95.1% achieved a career outcome. Of these, 91.4% were working, 3.6% pursued additional education. For those without a career outcome, 4.6% were still seeking. Virginia, Washington D.C., and Maryland were the most popular areas for advanced degree candidates to work. Of those working in Virginia, 37.0% worked in the Shenandoah Valley, 28.7% in Northern Virginia, and 23.5% worked in Central Virginia.
