Class involves forms of capital beyond the financial, even though that is often the start-and end-point when learning about and discussing it in any formal way. This plenary will encourage participants to consider concepts and lived experiences related to class; recognize exclusionary practices, procedures, as well as written and unwritten norms; and explore ways to engage class more equitably.
