#### Admissions Info

- The application opens on Sept. 1st with a priority deadline of Jan. 15th. After Jan. 15th we will continue to review applications and admit students on a space-available basis. The final application deadline is May 15th.
- Application requirements:
  - Completion of a baccalaureate degree (all majors welcome)
  - Three letters of recommendation
  - Transcripts
  - Resume
  - Personal statement addressing four questions
- After applications are reviewed, selected candidates will be contacted to participate in virtual or on-campus interviews in early February.

# How long does it take to complete the CSPA degree?

Full-time students begin in the fall semester and complete the 36-credit hour program in two academic years with a one-credit practicum over the summer. Other options are available for part-time students.



This is a Higher Education and Student Affairs degree with an 18 credit-hour counseling core. The counseling foundation provides Student Affairs educators with the skills, knowledge, and abilities to engage as mentors, advocates, and advisors. Check out the curriculum on our web site.

## The program is "practitioner focused." What does that mean?

All full-time students complete two graduate assistantships, and two 150-hour field experiences known as practicums. These experiences, in addition to the mentoring our students receive from supervisors, advisors, and faculty, provide you with the education and reflection to prepare you to be an effective Student Affairs educator upon graduation.

#### Do I need to take the GRE for admission?

The GRE is not required for the application to the CSPA program.
