Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) Core Requirements

All students seeking a BBA degree must complete all of the BBA core components (45 credit hours) and be formally accepted to the CoB as a part of their degree program. The BBA core components are broken down into two groups, the lower-level core (completed before formal acceptance) and the upper-level core (completed after formal acceptance).

BBA Core Progression: Formal Acceptance to the CoB

☐ Accounting Major (24 credit hours)

To be formally accepted to the College of Business, students seeking a BBA degree must complete the following requirements.

- ☐ Complete all lower-level BBA core requirements. No lower-level core course may be attempted more than two times.
- ☐ Earn a BBA GPA of at least a 2.7 earned in lower-level BBA core courses excluding calculus and COB 242. The university policy for calculating repeat credit and repeat forgiveness will be honored. Only grades received at JMU are used in the GPA calculation.
- ☐ Complete a COB 300 application by the deadline for the semester they intend to enroll in COB 300.

Accounting Major Requirements

Accounting majors complete a minimum of 24 credit hours of major-specific coursework. Additionally, accounting majors must meet the following progression standards:

- Accounting majors are required to earn a "B-" or better grade in both COB 241 and COB 242.
- Students are required to earn a "C-" or better grade in ACTG 343 before continuing to ACTG 344.
- No required 300 or 400-level accounting major course may be attempted more than two times. An "attempted course" is one in which a final letter grade, including "W", "WP" and "WF", is recorded on the student's official JMU transcript.
- Have a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or better in the major subjects at JMU.

Master of Science in Accounting Program (MSA)

he School of Accounting offers both a Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) degree and a Master of Science in Accounting (M.S.) degree. The 120 credit-hour undergraduate degree consists of the four-year major in accounting, leading to the B.B.A. degree. During your junior year, you can choose to meet with your adviser to discuss enrolling in the graduate program, which leads seamlessly to the award of the B.B.A. degree after four years, followed by the M.S. degree at the end of five years and 150 hours of study.

the JMU M.S. in Accounting program gives you what you need to compete in today's complex business and regulatory environment. This full-time, on-campus program prepares you to succeed, whether your goal is as lofty as the corner office at a Fortune 500 company, or as straightforward as passing the CPA exam. The coursework sharpens your technical skills while strengthening your grasp of professional responsibility. A student must be admitted to the MSA program in order to enroll in graduate level courses.

Admission to the MSA program is competitive. Seniors should apply to the program over winter break at the conclusion of the fall semester. The GMAT Exam is not required for JMU undergraduates.
