Whether working with a professional sports team, at a commercial fitness business or for a parks and recreation department, you'll need competencies in marketing, leadership and project management to be successful. This major will challenge you to think critically, to use technology and to appreciate the global community. Through research and development projects you'll question boundaries of knowledge and promote effective practices in sport and recreation management.

As practica are often completed during the Fall or Spring semester while taking other classes, many students complete them by working with JMU Athletics, Harrisonburg and Rockingham County Parks and Rec, Sports Analytics, Special Olympics and other local agencies. Internships require a much longer commitment and serve as a capstone experience, allowing you to showcase all you have learned by working for an agency similar to one for which you would like to work as a professional.
