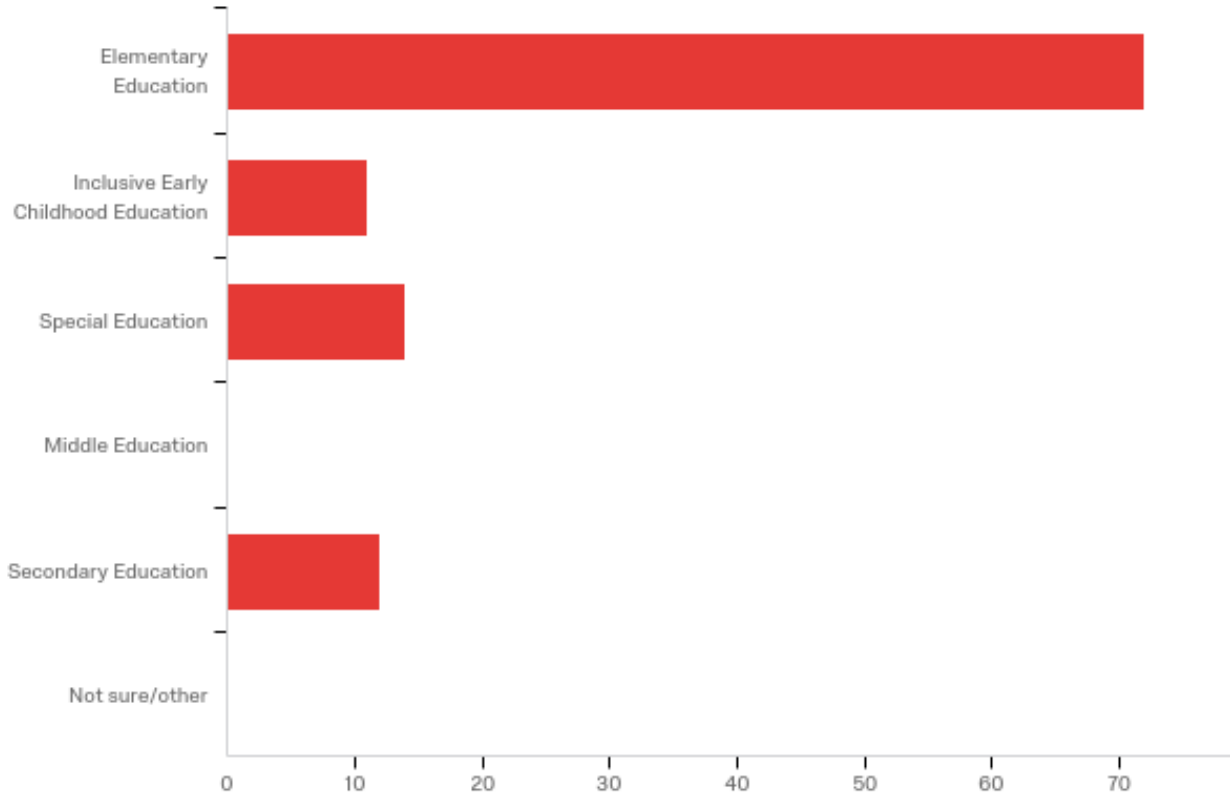

What is your Education major?

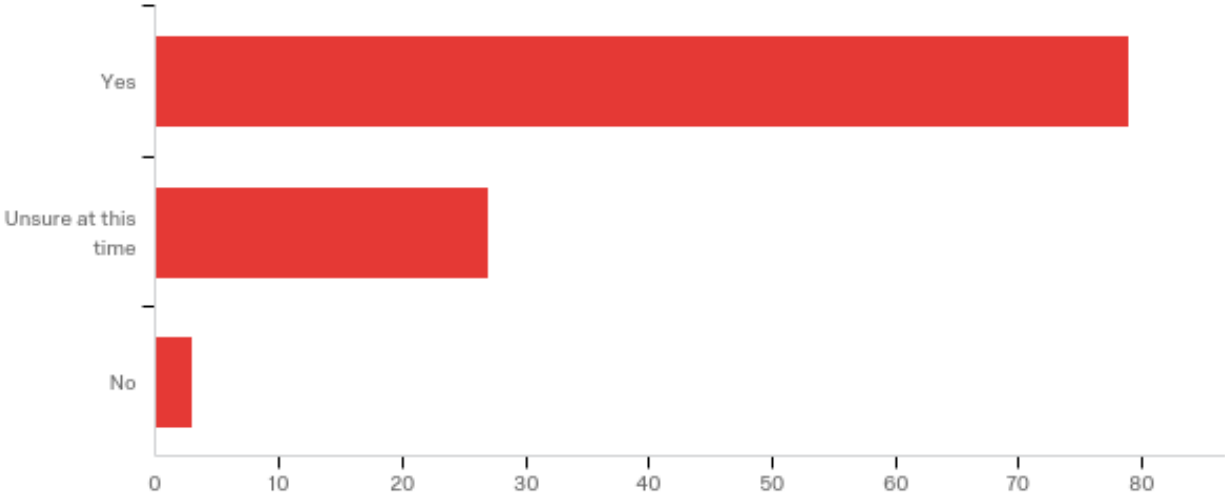

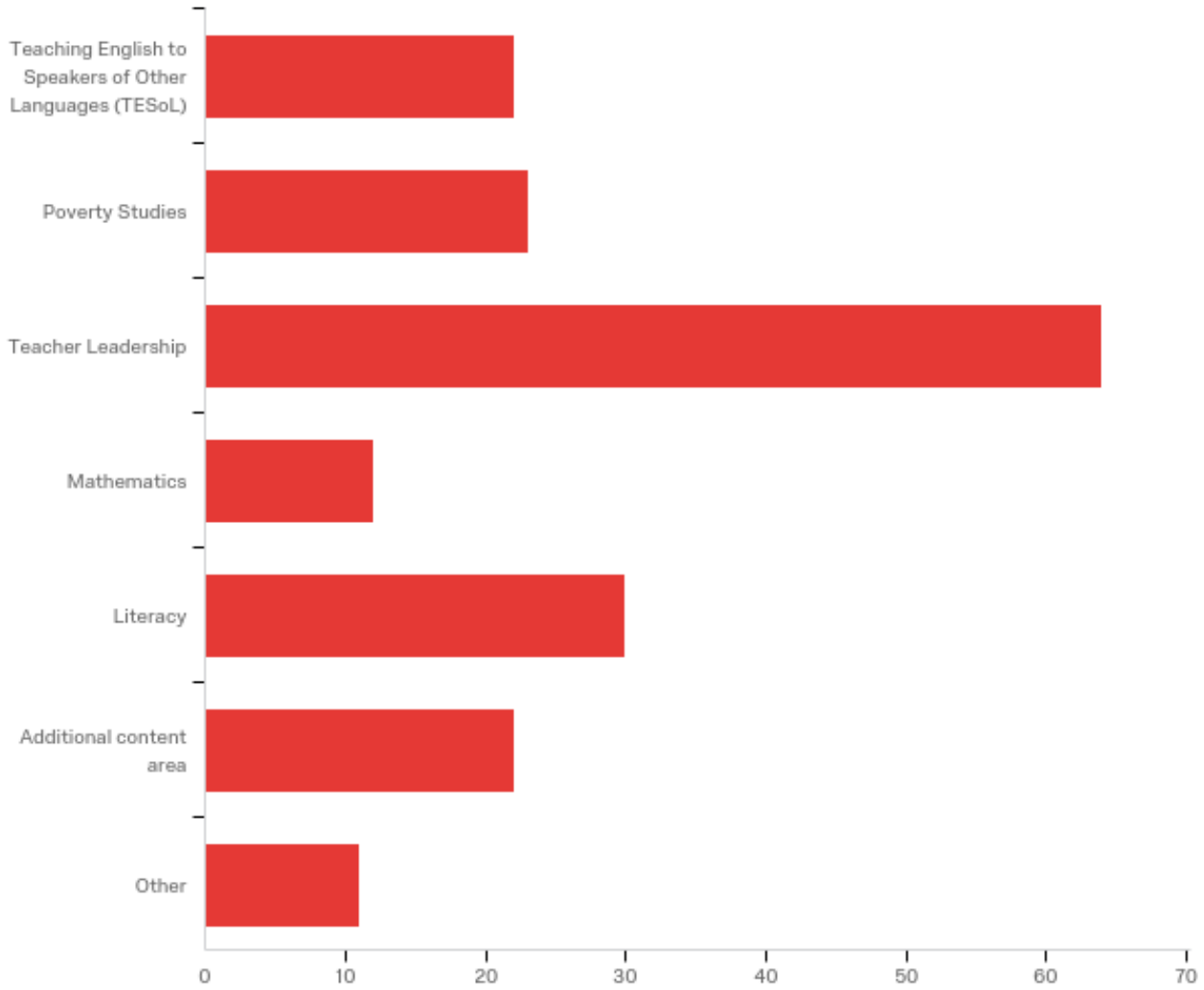
